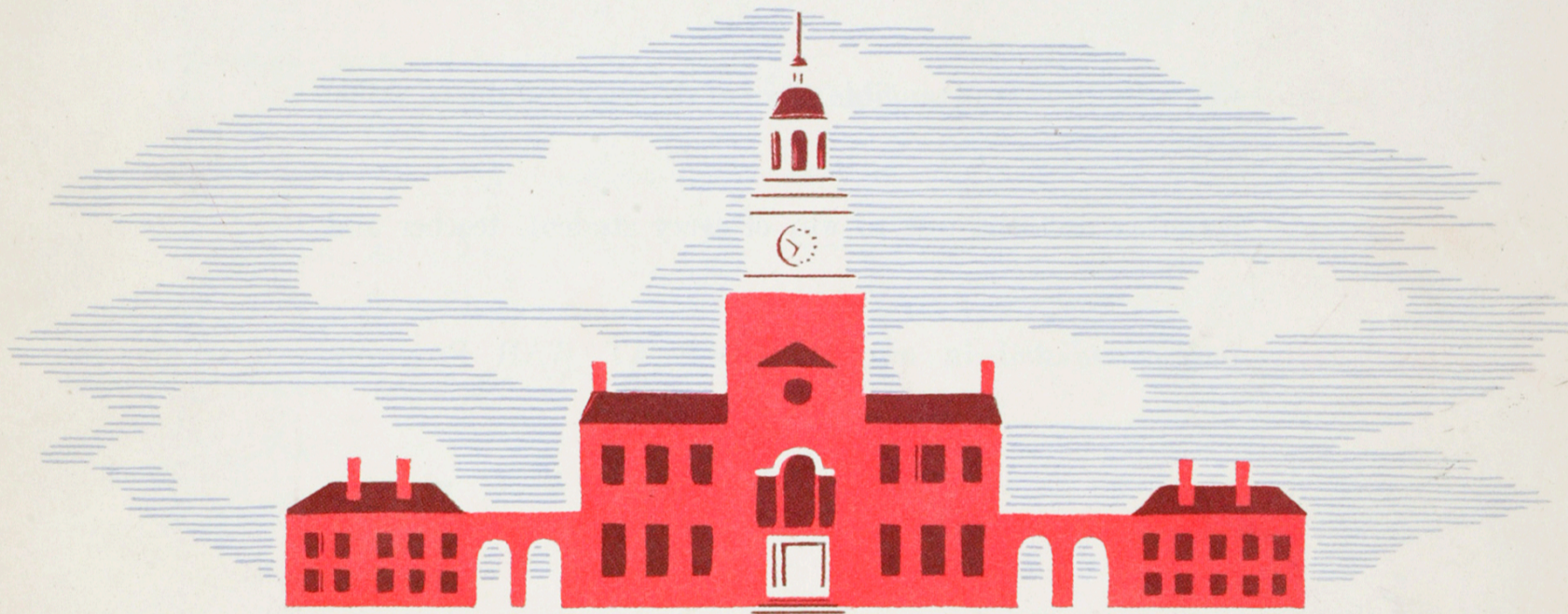

of scrap.

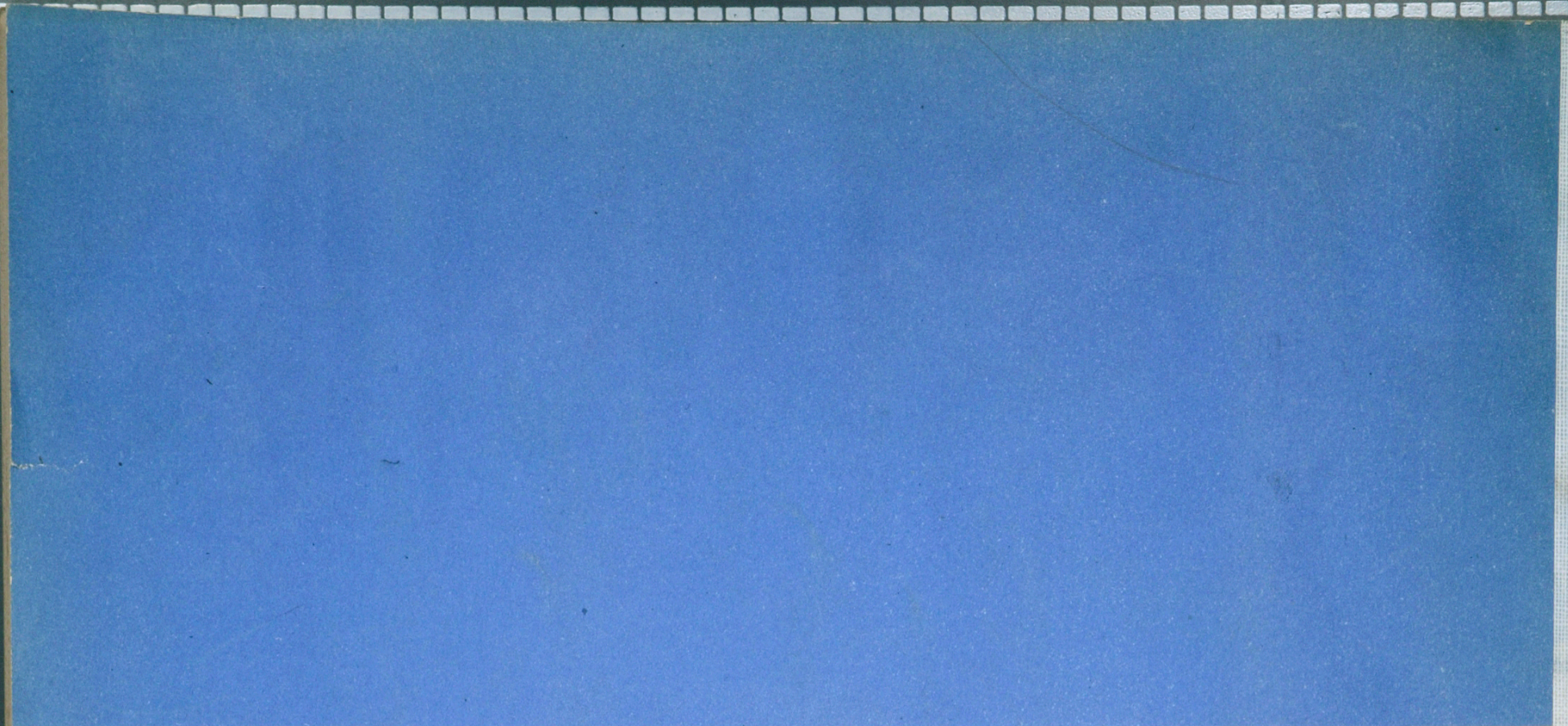
