Liberty Alight

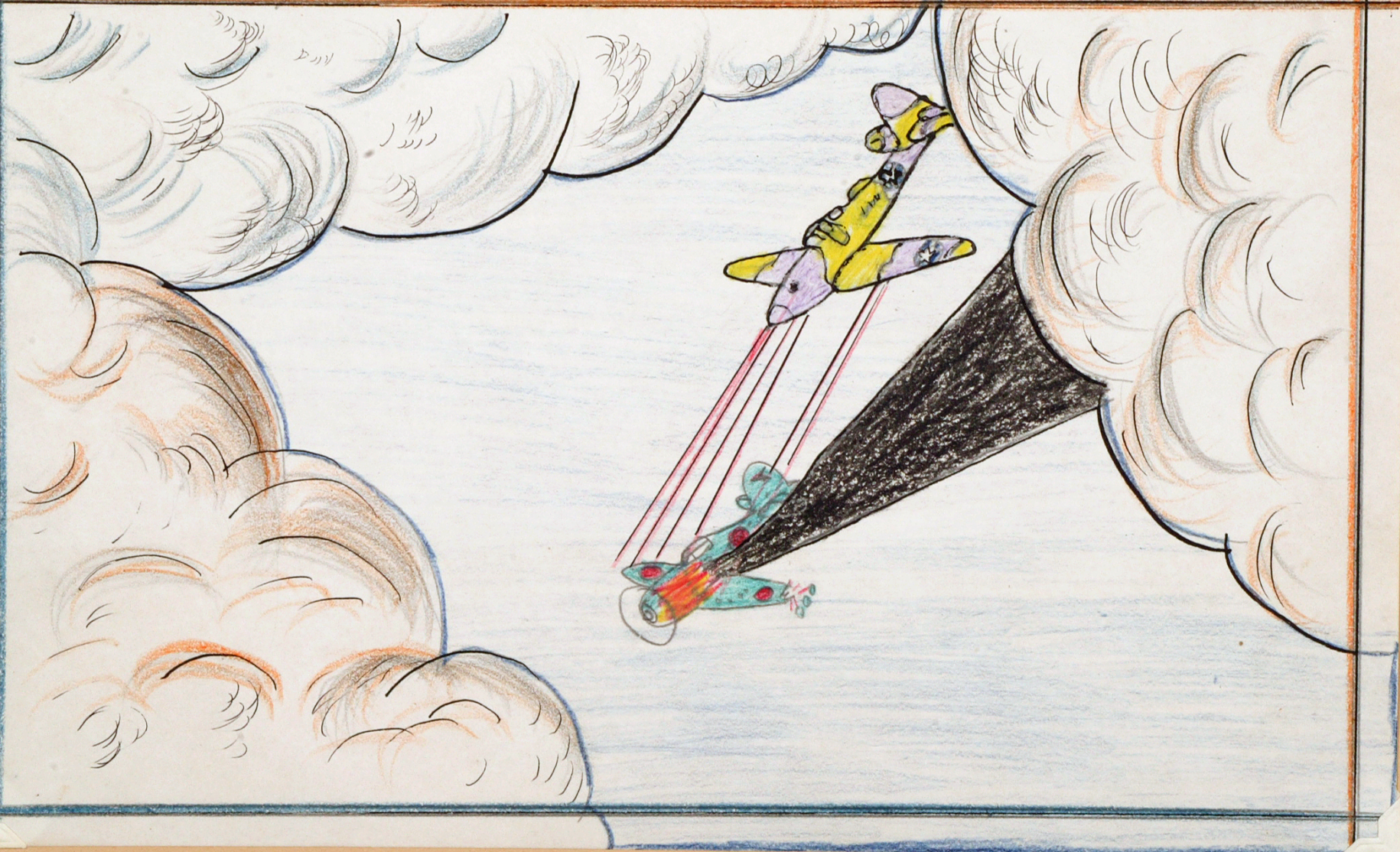
