PREFACE

In the following manner our school is emphasizing the Schools At War program to serve, save and conserve.

We started our Schools At War program when the fall term began. The most important phase of this program has been the sale of war stamps and bonds. The aim of each room is to be one hundred per cent. By this we mean that each child will have purchased at least one war stamp. To stimulate interest, each room has set aside a certain period each day during which patriotism is stressed and stamps are offered for sale. A booth has been constructed and placed in the hall. Each day at nine fifteen and one fifteen a stamp parade is held. Children wishing to buy stamps, parade through the hall to the booth where they may buy them.

The fourth grade teacher has used an automobile race to stimulate further interest in purchasing war stamps.

As each child buys a stamp, a car with his name printed on it is placed on the race track. Each time a stamp is bought the child is allowed to move his racer forward.


The first child to buy a twenty-five dollar bond is the winner of the race.

A special assembly program was presented by the pupils of the Dixie and Jefferson Davis Elementary Schools at the high school auditorium. The admission charge was the purchase of a ten cent war stamp.

Our second contribution to the war effort has been the participation in two scrap drives. In the first drive, the children brought the scrap to school where it was weighed by the teachers. The third grade collected the greatest amount. Each pupil in the room had collected his weight or over. They were given a picnic as a prize. The scrap was sold by the school and the money derived from the sale was used in the war effort. In the second drive each child sold his scrap directly to the dealer. The money derived belonged to the individual who bought war stamps with it.

Active participation in the Junior Red Cross is the third phase of our program. In each of the four grades each child is a member. The first and second grades are making napkins for the holidays throughout the year. The third grade has made calendars. The fourth grade has completed crossword puzzle books and at present is making tally cards, score pads and checker boards.
