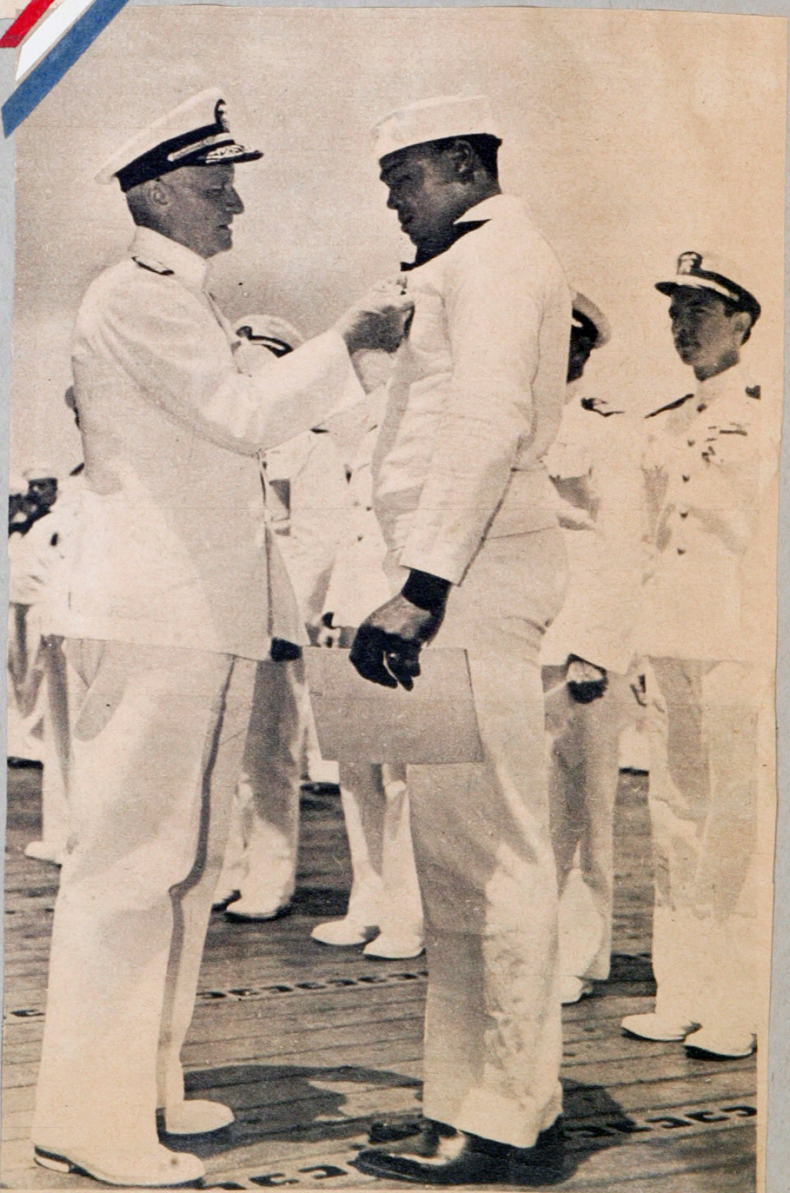

# Victory On the Home Front!



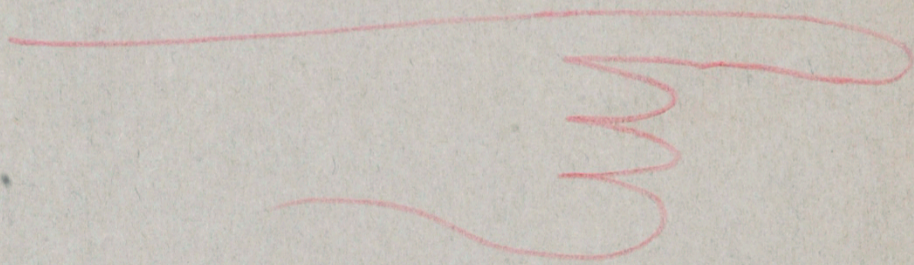
