In order to promote our drive slogans and posters were made by the children from the fifth through the eighth grades. In our scrapbook we have examples of some of this work.

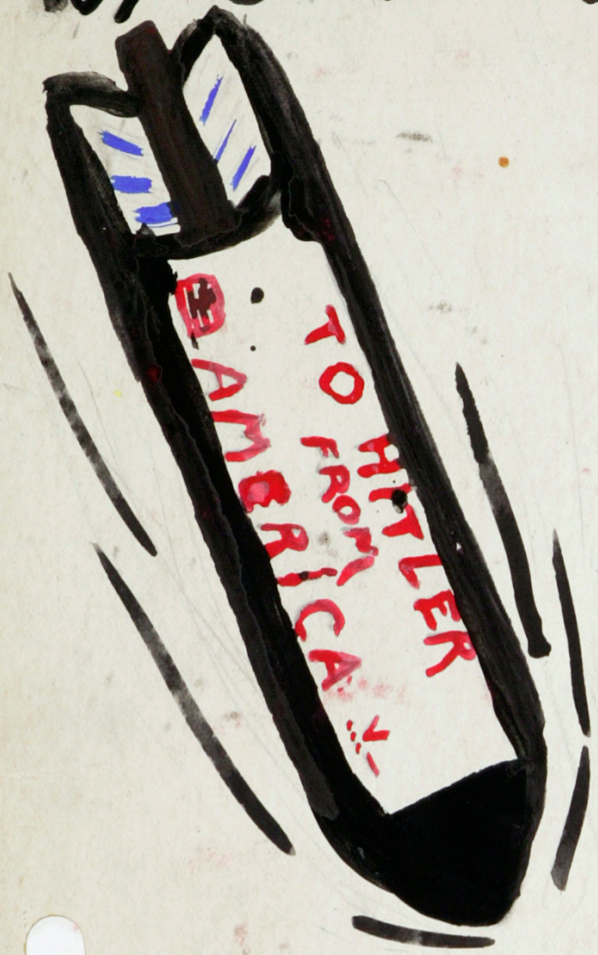
A contest was held to see which room could bring in the most scrap.

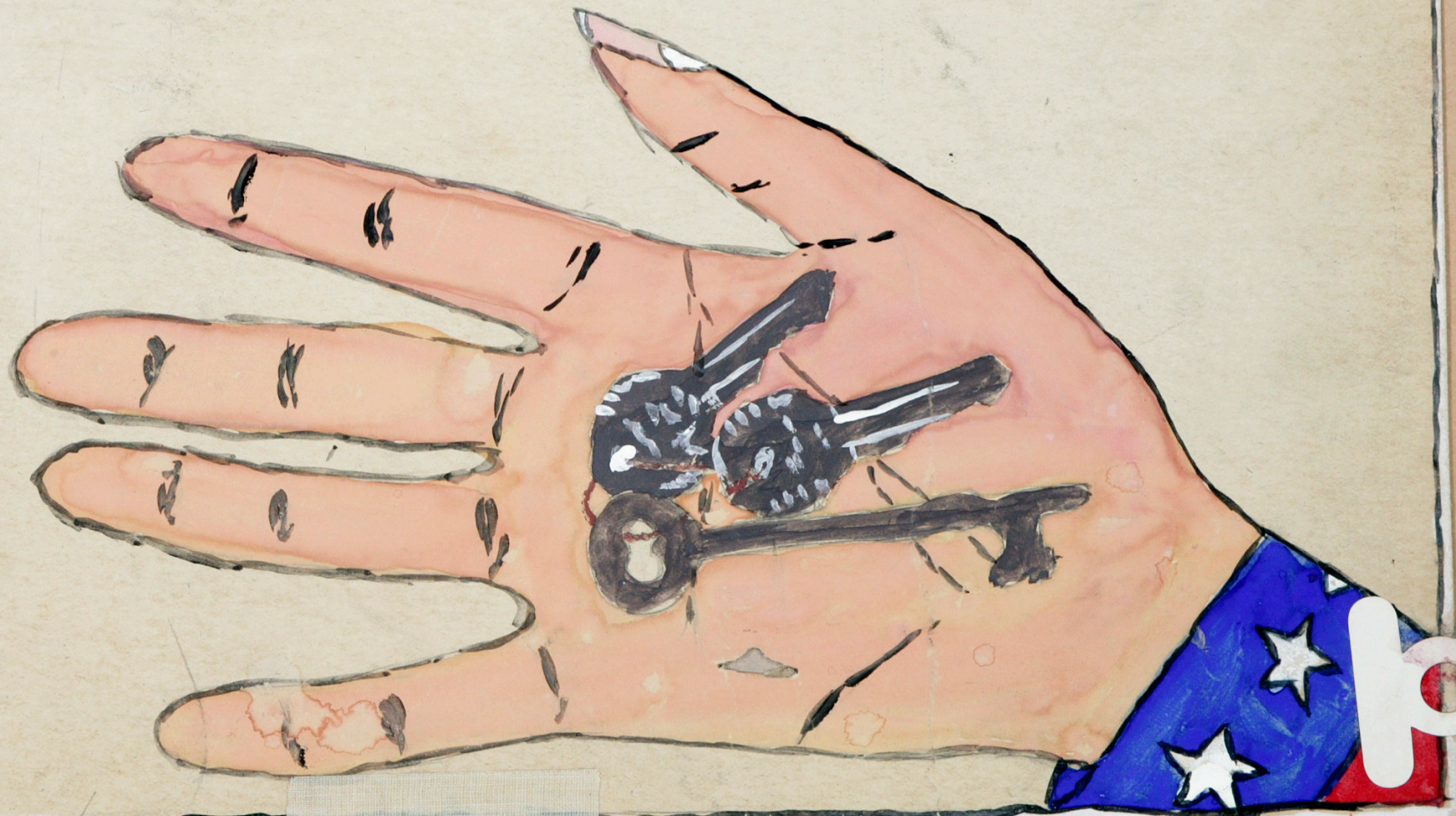

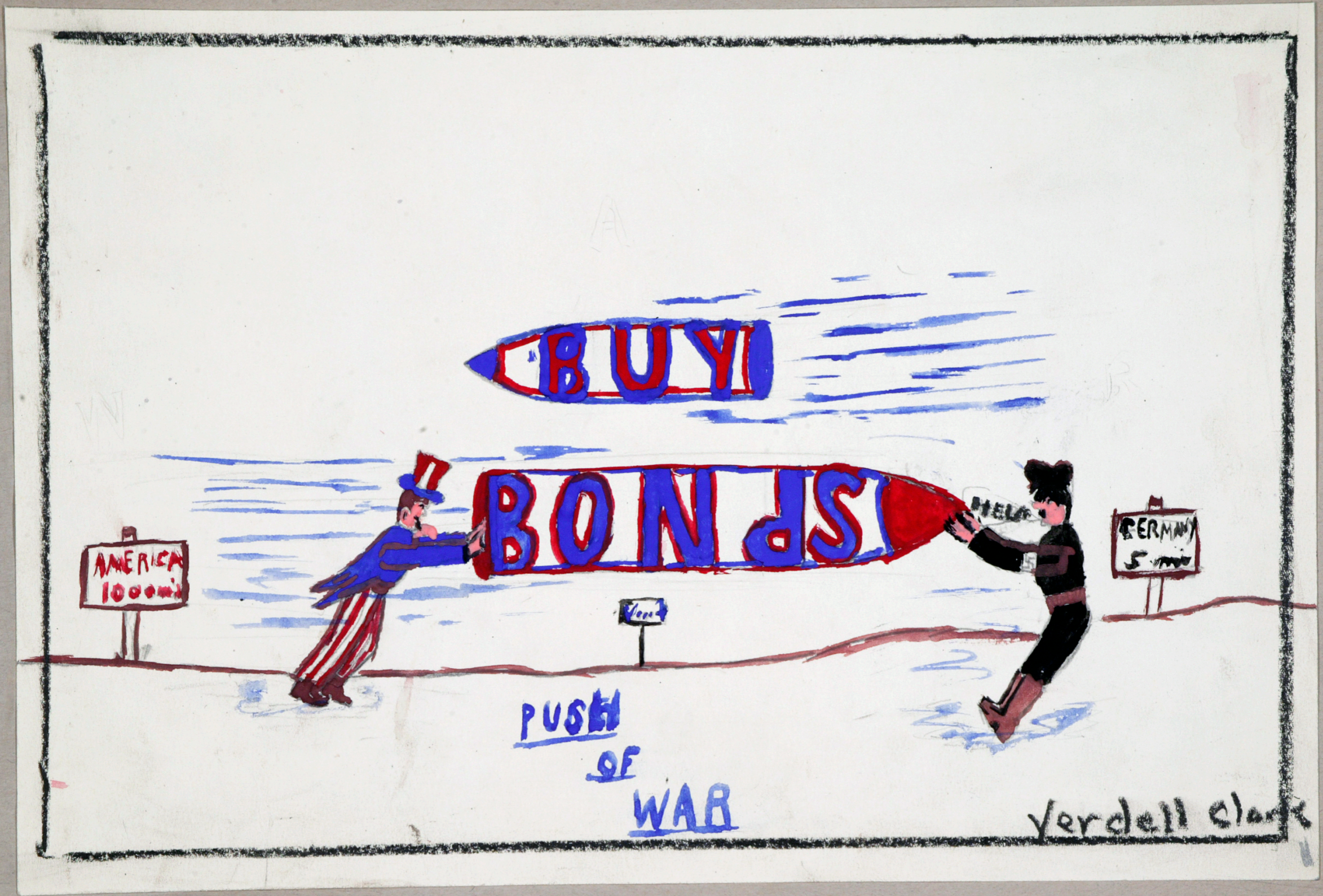

We began our Junior Red Cross work in October by all of our rooms being 100% in membership.

These are some of the projects we have been working on:

The girls as well as boys helped in knitting an afghan which is to be used in the hospitals. There are illustrations about our afghan elsewhere in our War Saving Scrap Book. Another afghan has been started.

The children have been bringing cartoons to school and they are being placed in a scrap book to be sent to disabled soldiers. One has been entirely filled and another one started.

Crossword puzzles also furnish amusement for the sick, so numerous puzzles along with their answers have been mounted on colored paper to be placed into a crossword puzzle booklet.

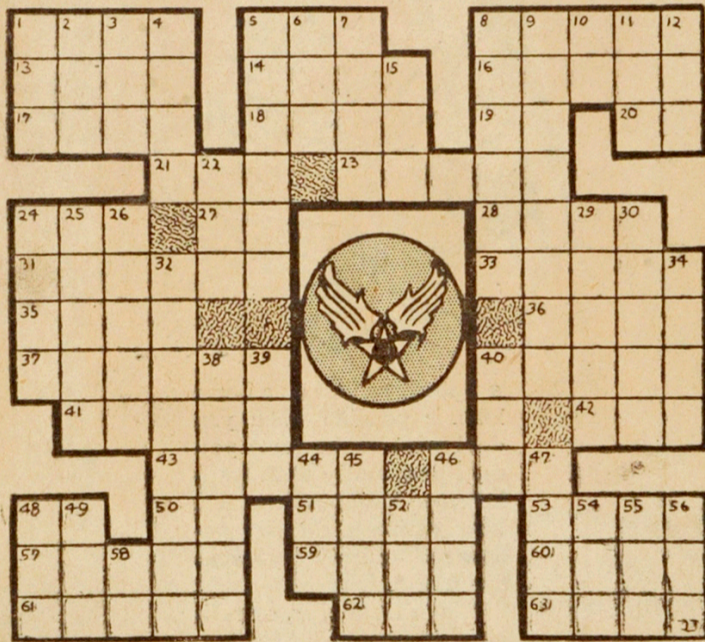
