LONGVIEW SCHOOL* DISTRICT# 25- NOBLE CO. OKLAHOMA.

Our school is a one-room school of fourteen pupils, Grades 1-8 inclusive. It is located fourteen miles north of Perry, our county seat and nearest town.

We in our school have followed the suggestions of the Handbook issued us with our scrap-book for the School at War Program. These suggestions were to Save, Serve, and Conserve.

Each of the pupils in our school, and both of their parents, have in some way or another helped in carrying out our program.

Every home has saved and bought War Bonds and Stamps. Every Child in our school has a Stamp book. (We have Placed in our scrap-book a graph showing the amount of bonds and stamps of the pupils in our school.) Several pupils have a \$25.00 War Bond, which they have bought themselves. They did this by denying themselves of candy, etc. They have sold 4-H Club stock and bought bonds also..

Every pupil realizes that we Serve our country by buying bonds; That we Conserve money and war materials for war effort by not spending, and that we save for our own personal security.

SERVICE OF OUR SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY.

The home of every pupil in our school are doing everything they can to serve our country. The mother's are seeing that the family is well fed; that we get the proper foods, and the amount required for each person. Every home plans a bigger and better garden for canning purposes this year.

The Farm Women's Club in our community are doing their part. They sponsor the making of Surgical Dressings. The Club furnishes the building and fuel, and help make the dressings. Mothers of our pupils do their part in making the dressings also. Many mothers do sewing and knitting for the Red Cross.

Pupils of our school have made posters and pamphlets of defense, and written essays and made drawings for the Schools at War Program, using their own ideas.

Every child in the school is a member of the Junior Red Cross, and has been for the past two years.

LONG VIEW SCHOOL BOND.

Longview School District # 35 has a \$ 25.00 War Bond.
In securing this bond we sponsored an entertainment for the public. We put a charge of twenty-cents for adults and ten cents for children.

Every pupil took an active part in the program.

Mr. Murdock, teacher of Long View school, Mrs. Murdock, and Mr. and Mrs. John Green, of the school district, presented a one act comedy "It Can't Be Done".

From this entertainment we made \$12.00. In the County Fair which was held in September, 1942, our school won \$6.75 on their booth. We took the proceeds from this entertainment and the fair and bought our bond.

SCHOOL CONSERVE.

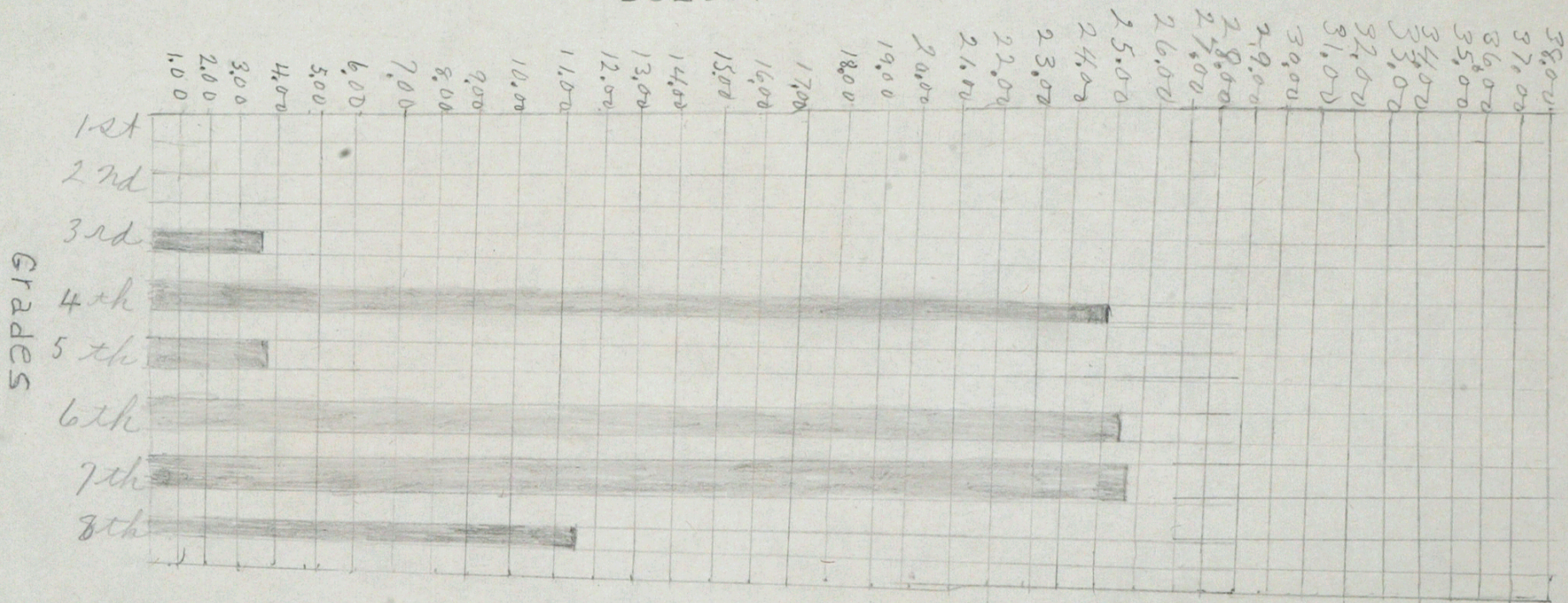
Long View School has made a collection of scrap rubber, paper, iron, and tin needed for war production.

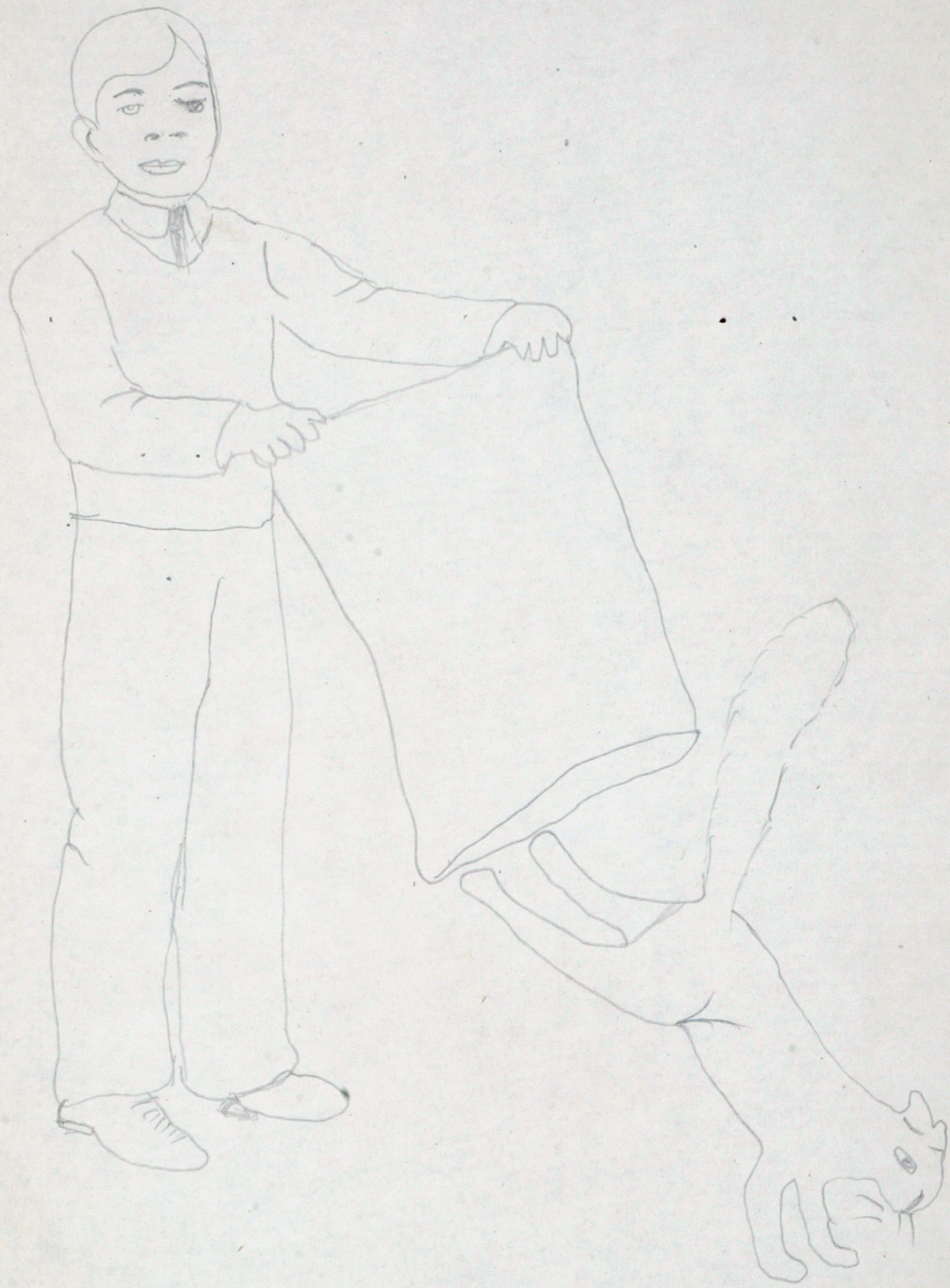

Food For Victory

As everyone knows we have been rationed on food as well as gas and rubber.

We must feed our allied soldiers besides feeding our soldiers and feed them well.

A lot of people say we have enough meat and other foods but they don't know how many people we have to feed.

There are a lot of things that we import that we don't get any more. The reason for this is because the Japs have taken the islands where the things were raised. 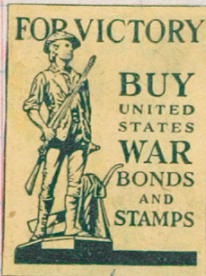

Bonds and Stamps

Bonds and stamps are very important for defense. They help the government buy needs for air planes, ships and other fighting materials. They are also a very interesting hobby.

I have three 10 cents stamps and I am going to get more. Several in our school has bonds and most of them have stamps.

I am selling scrap to the government. and with the money I am going to get stamps.



If you buy a \$18.75 defense bond after ten years it would bring \$25.00.

If each girl, boy, woman and man would buy one defense stamp each month. There would

be thousands of dollars to help Uncle Sam each month.

If every five persons in the United States would buy one \$18.75 defense bond just think how much money there would be to buy jeeps, tanks, ships, airplanes, and anti aircraft guns.



If boys and girls would buy defense stamps instead of so much candy, ice cream, and pop, it would help the government so much that it

would surprise you at the amount of stamps bought.

The poster above is to make people more interested in defense bonds.

By the end of the year I hope to have at least one \$25 bond.

School Scrap Drive

All schools, clubs, and associations are having a scrap drive. Our school is having a scrap drive and it is very interesting.

We divided the district into several parts so that child could have another farm to help gather up the scrap.

We were surprised at the amount we gathered up. I think scrap drives are an important thing they help build many army needs.

I have collected eight old tires and about 200 lbs of scrap iron steel and aluminum. The farm that I helped gather scrap gathered about 400 lbs.

We gathered scrap from

creeks and many other places.

Many things are made of steel, they use half scrap and half steel to make many things.

One old scrap tire will make 20 parachutes trooper boots.

Sixty old tooth paste tubes will make all necessary tin in a Flying Fortress.

One old iron will make 2 steel helmets or 30 hand grenades.

Half of every tank, ship, gun, and submarine is made from scrap steel. So I think a scrap drive is very important.



Gasoline Rationing

We are having gasoline ration to save rubber, because people use their tires too much.

Gasoline rationing will stop trucks from going so far and wearing out their tires.

This is a war we must fight for freedom and they need gasoline for airplanes. We will have enough gasoline to do what we need to.



Tire Rationing

It takes much rubber to win a war. Every time a large bomber plain goes up into the air it has to have a new set of tires. Because when it lands the wheels slid a ways and burns off the rubber.



This gives you an idea about

where a lot of the rubber goes.
This army scout car has a continuous rubber track on the rear.
it is called a "square tire".

Rubber makes for quietness
and permits high speed.

Censoring Mail to Soldiers

Mail to soldiers has to be censored. They censor them for having a date on them, where they are at, and many other things.

I have an Uncle in the army he has been working on airplanes that they are fighting with, and said it was very interesting.



I have been writing to him a lot. He has written to me several times and sent me one card. I think everybody should write to soldiers. They

get lonesome, they like to get letters, so I think you should write to someone.

National Red Cross

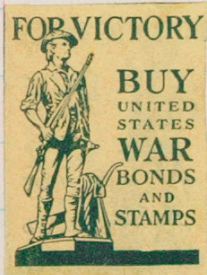
The National Red Cross does many things to help win the war. They make clothes for the people whose homes have been bombed. My mother made five dresses for little girls. She made five suits for little boys.

They do this because they may need to use them before the bandages are sterilized.

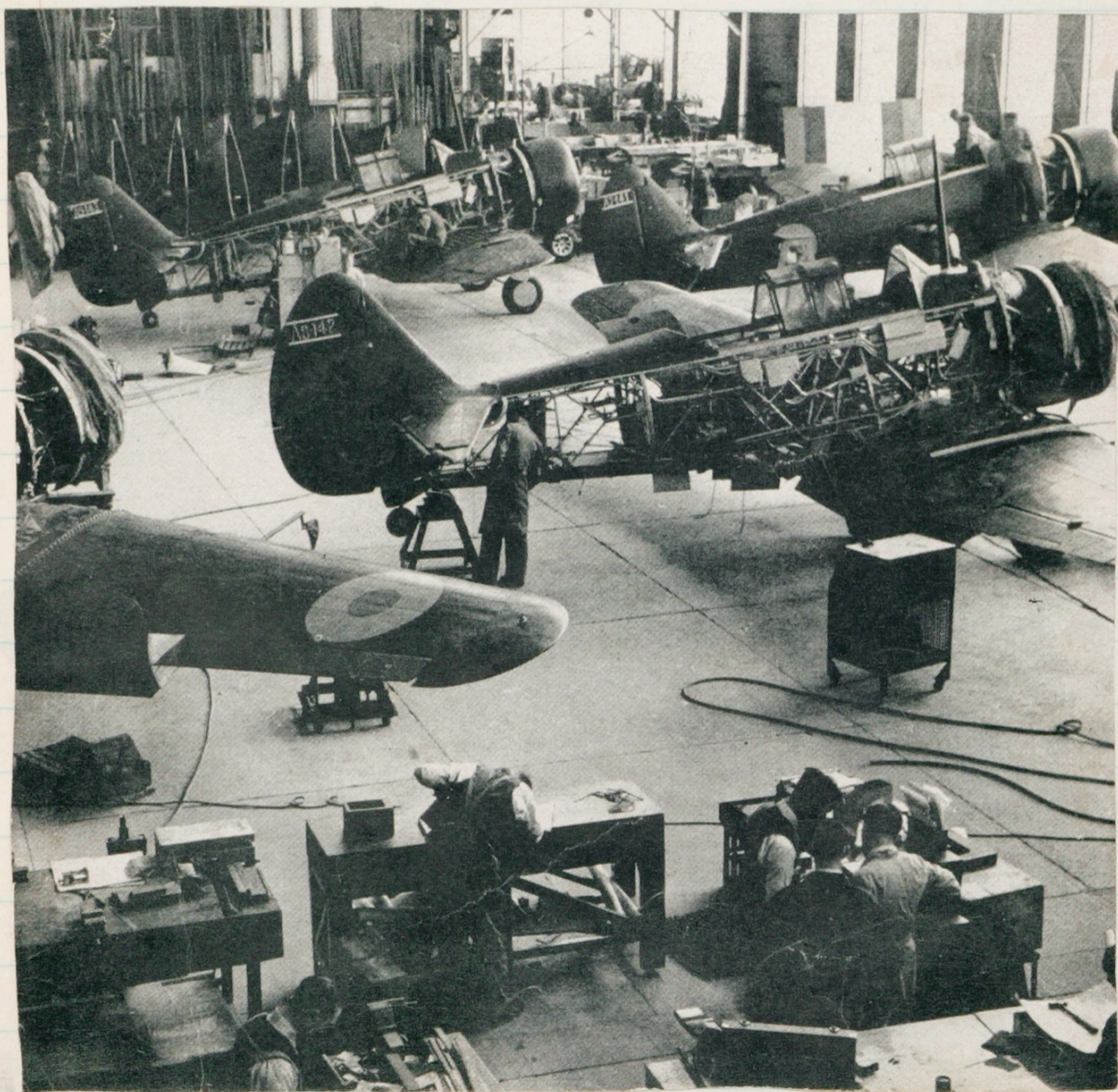
Our neighbor made

helped make some baby clothes.

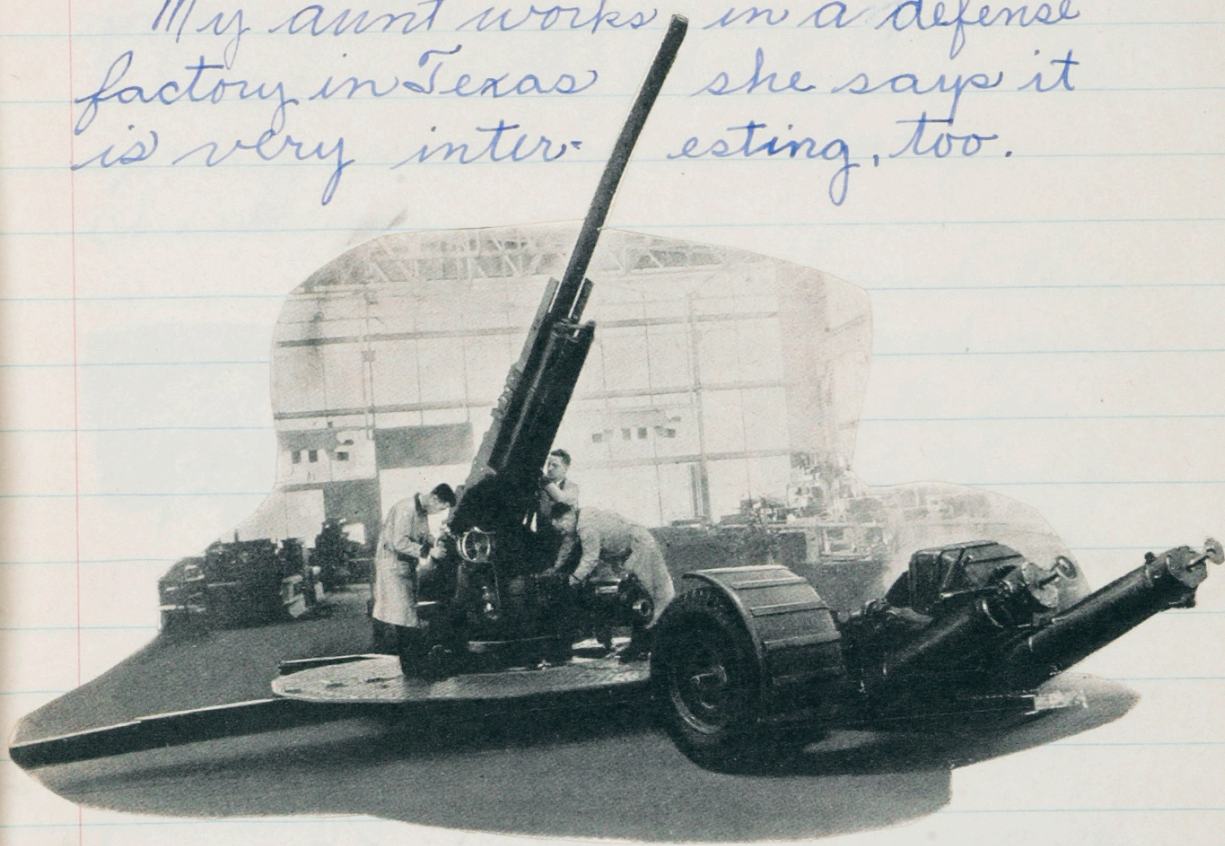
Defense Projects and Plants

My mother and father are now milching seven cows and feeding 5 calves.

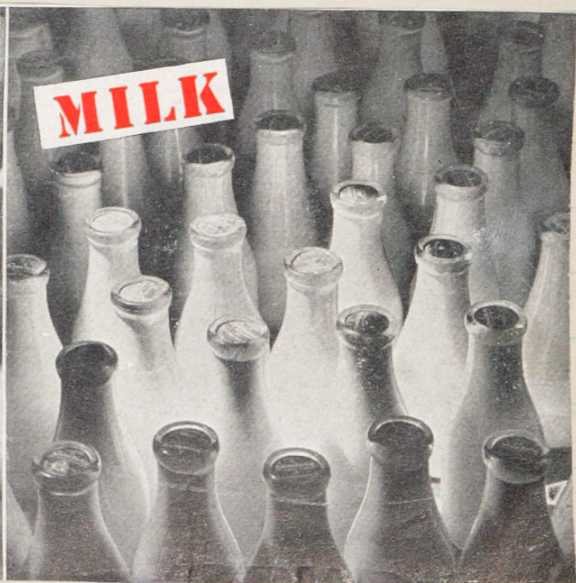
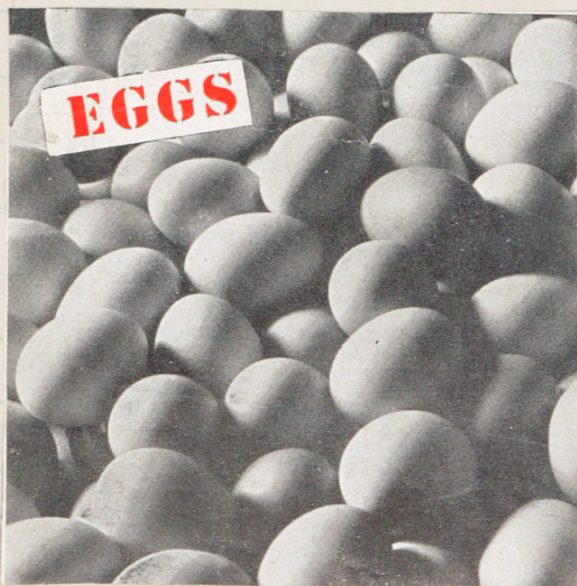
I also help feed nine pigs.
