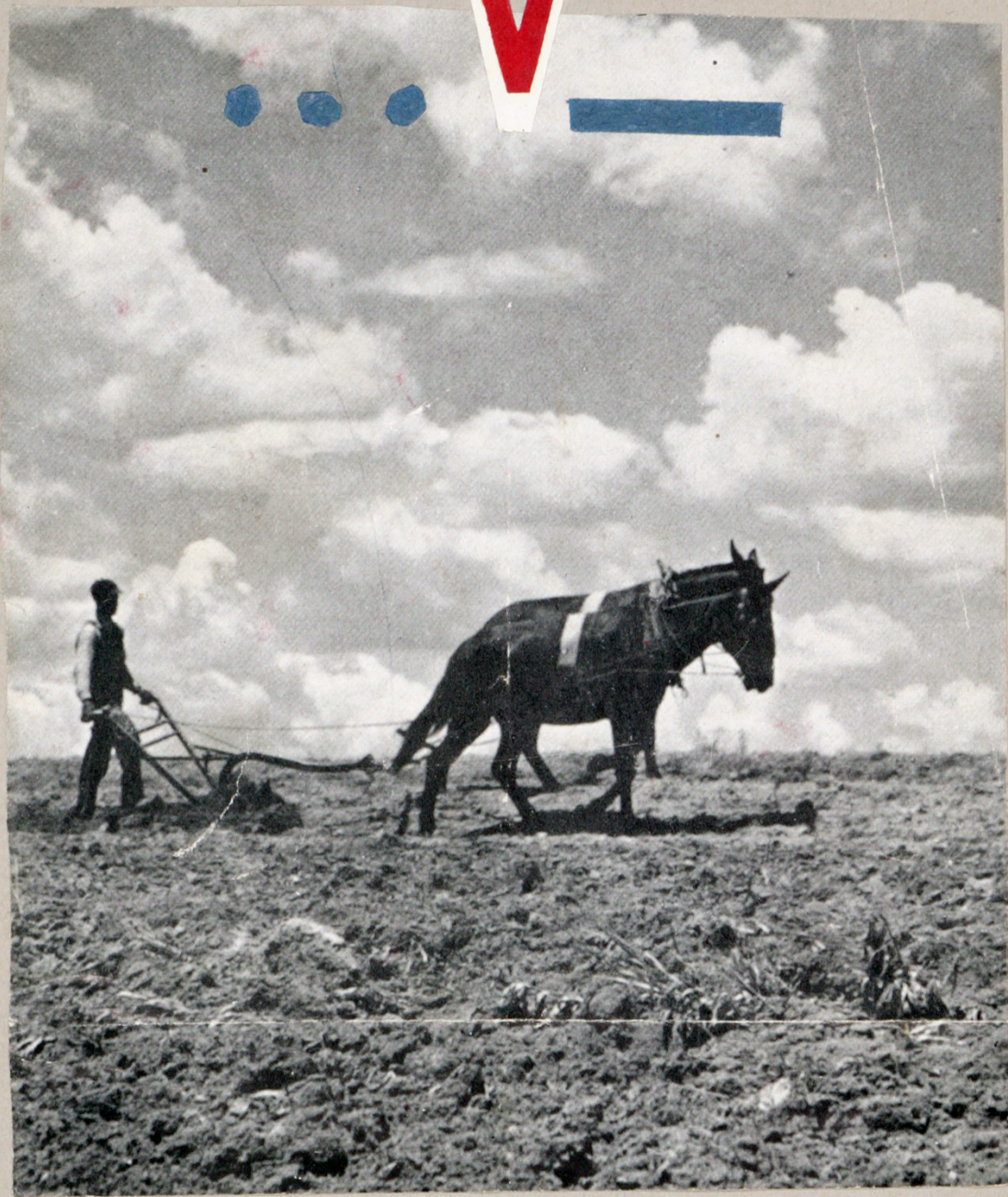

The boys have aided local farmers in preventing and controlling prairie fires.

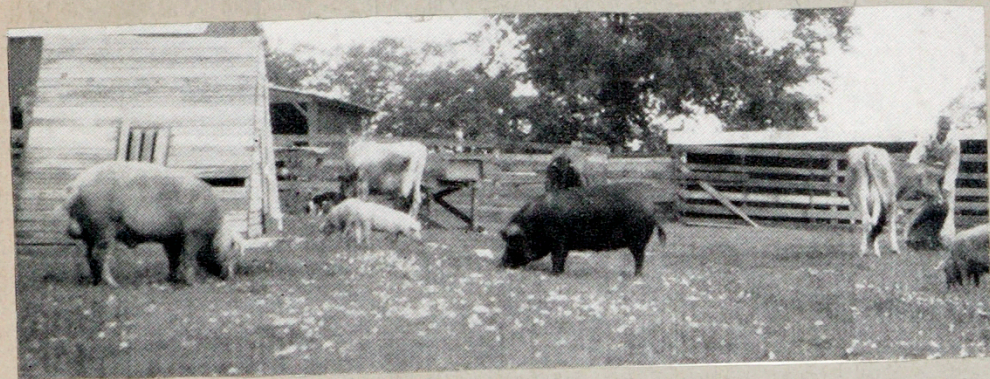

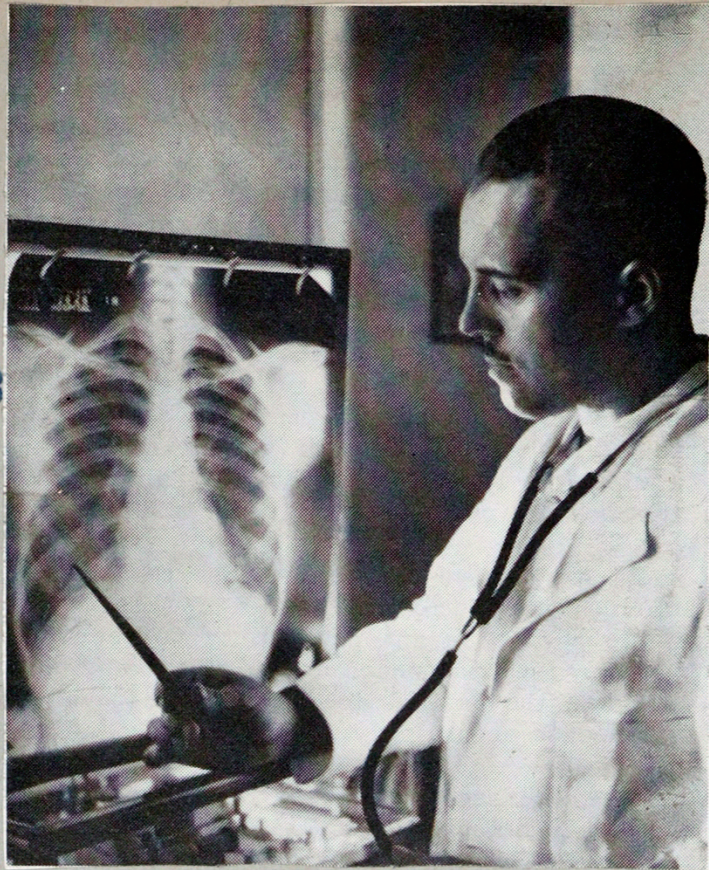
The Farm Women's Club, is made up of 32 members.

The club member's alone canned 8000 quarts of fruit, vegetables and meat.



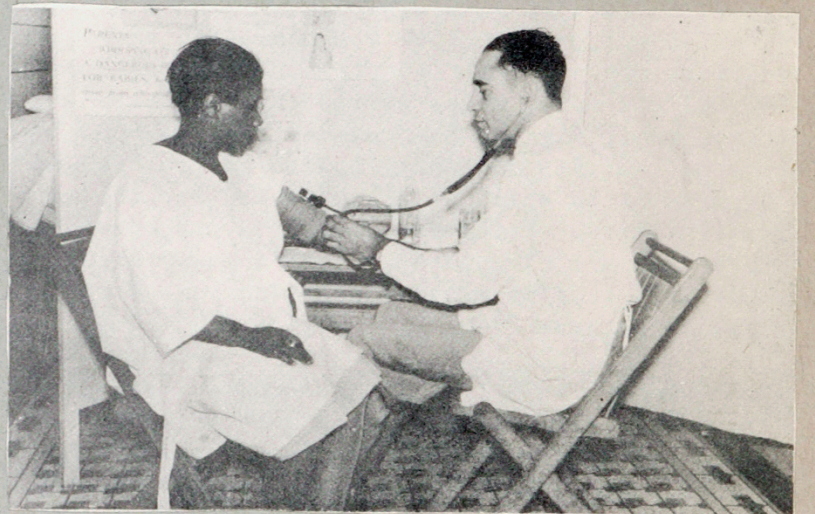
The women own twenty-one pressure cookers.
