Southside Sets Pace in Sales At Bond Rallies

A series of war bond rallies sponsored by Jackson county school districts in cooperation with the American Legion's bond selling campaign for January will be brought to a close Thursday and Friday nights.

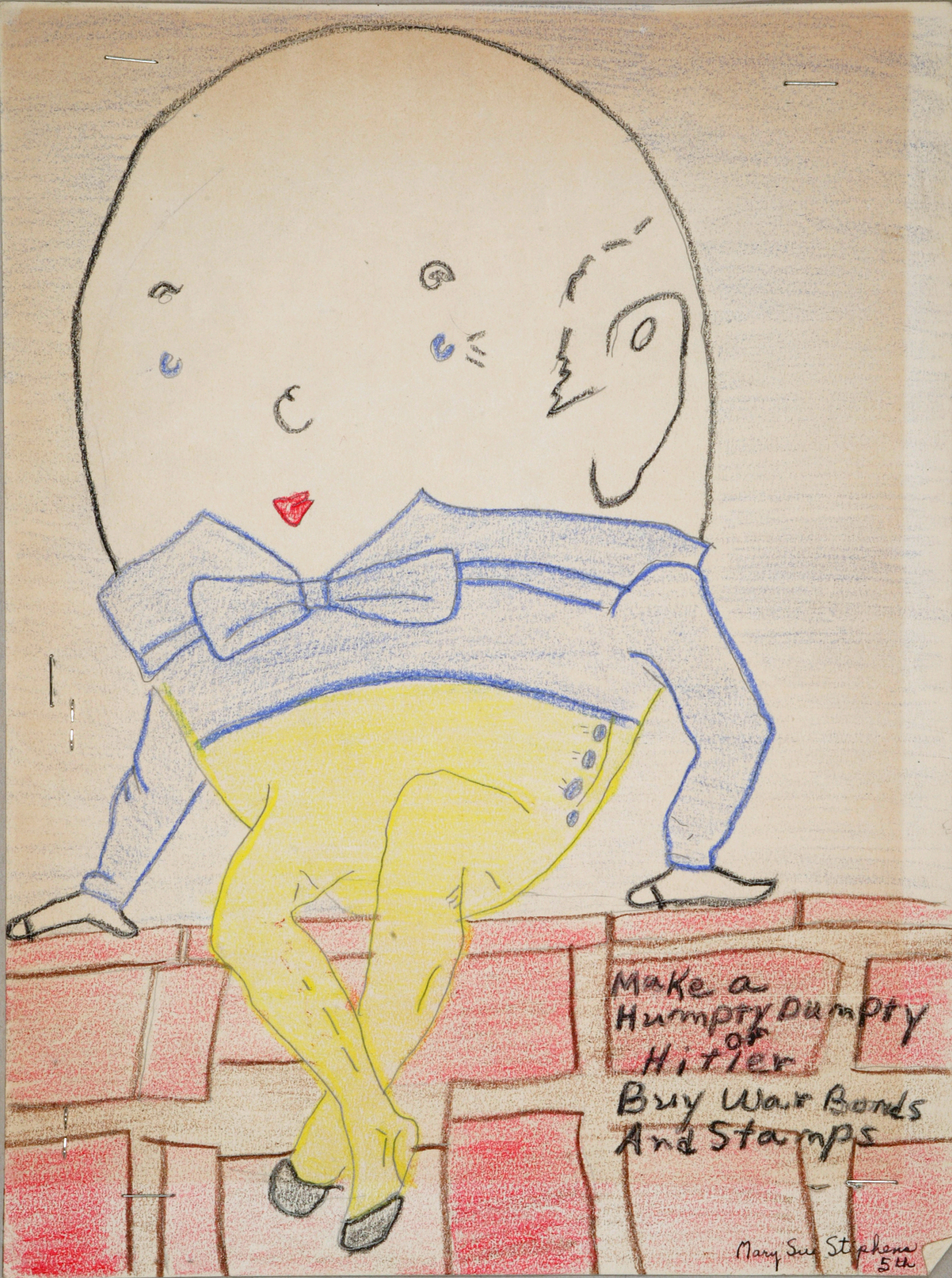
Olustee high school auditorium will be the scene of a bond rally at 7:30 p. m. Thursday. Humphreys and Porter High schools will hold rallies Friday night.

The Southside school's rally Wednesday night brought the best bond and stamp selling results reported thus far. Ray Claiborne, superintendent, reported a total of \$2,819.70 worth of bonds and stamps sold during the evening.

The Southside School set aside the month of January in which to make a war bond and stamp drive at school. In addition to the bonds and stamps sold at the special program mentioned in the clipping above, the grade school bought \$335.35 and the high school bought \$196.70, making a total of \$532.05 in war bonds and stamps purchased at school.

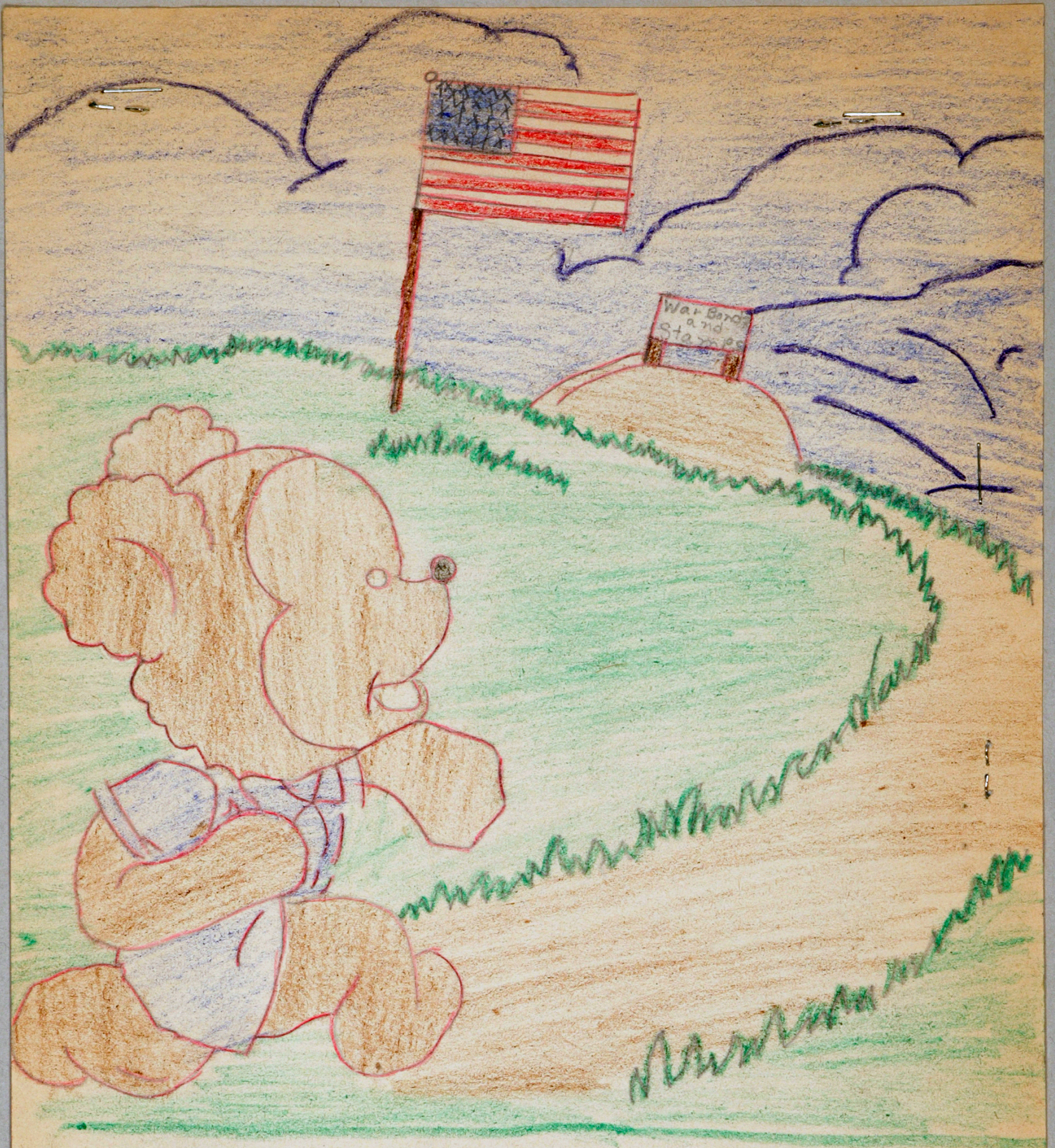

War Bonds and Stamps

Only one out of twenty Americans will be called to active duty, to face hardship, injury, and death. The rest of us are needed here. We all can't go. But we can help.

Probably you are one of the more than eighty million patriotic Americans who already are purchasing War Savings Bonds and Stamps. This is helping to meet the cost of war and to avoid the dangers of inflation. Besides it helps in the future. Our fighting men are giving their all to win. The least we can do at home is to lend our money to the war effort.

At least ten percent of our income should be invested in War Bonds and Stamps. There are three kinds of bonds; Series C, D, and E. Series C bonds are for individuals offered at seventy-five percent of their face value. Each owner is limited to \$3,750 (cost price) for one calendar year. These bonds are issued for \$25, \$50, \$100, \$500, and \$1000. Any bond may be redeemed in whole or part after sixty days from date of issue in accordance with the table of redemption values on the face

of the bond. These bonds mature ten years from date of issue. This is an investment yield of 2.7 per cent compounded semi-annually.

Series F and G Bonds are for individuals who have already invested the limit in C bonds and for larger investors such as corporations, associations, etc. who are not permitted to buy C bonds. These bonds may be purchased up to \$100,000 (cost price) for one calendar year. Both F and G Bonds are redeemable in whole or part after six months from date of issue at fixed redemption value on first of any month with at least of one month's notice.

Series F Bonds are offered at seventy four per cent face value and will mature twelve years from date of issue. This is an investment yield of 2.53 per cent compounded semi-annually.

Series G are current income bonds offered at par, and bearing interest at 2.5 percent annum which is paid semi-annually by Treasury check. They will mature twelve years from date of issue.
