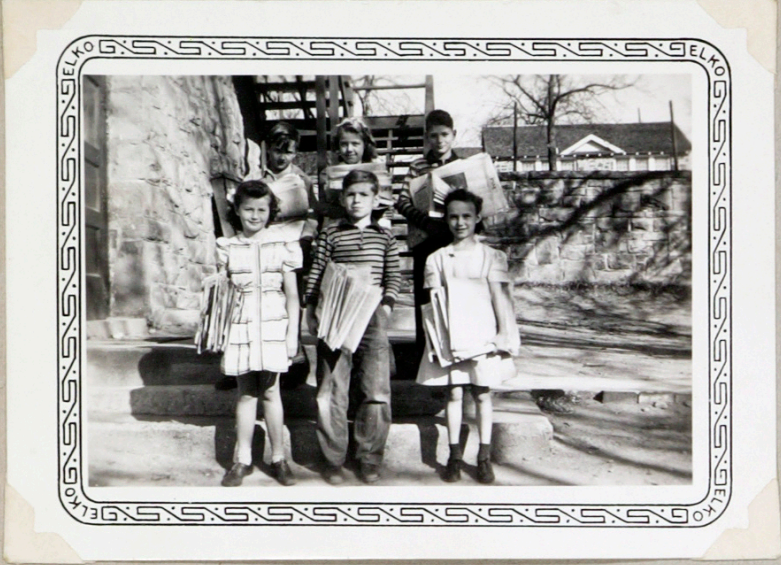

These words are taken from the Stars-Spangled Banner, which Francis Scott Key wrote while on board a British warship, during the bombardment of Fort Mc Henry. The Stars-Spangled Banner is the American National Anthem.

To-day we are fighting a great war as that of 1812, we are trying and will preserve peace while there is a world. Many brave men have died for our nation so that it may maintain its freedom. Courageous men died at Pearl Habor, Guam, Wake Island and many other places. In Pearl Harbor lives were sacrificed when the Japanese pulled a sneak attack early in the morning of December 7, 1941. At Wake Island a few hand full of brave Marines stuck to their post, and fought so valiantly against overwhelming odds. The Japs had about 1500 soldiers against 375 Marines. The Marines did not die in vain for they were fighting a just cause.

We have two great men who are doing everything to bring peace to the world. These men met on the African soil to discuss matters over. These men are: The President of the United States, Franklin D. Roosevelt and The Prime Minister of England, Winston Churchill.

The Russian Army has played a great part in this war, some day they hope to occupy Berlin instead of the goose-steppers.

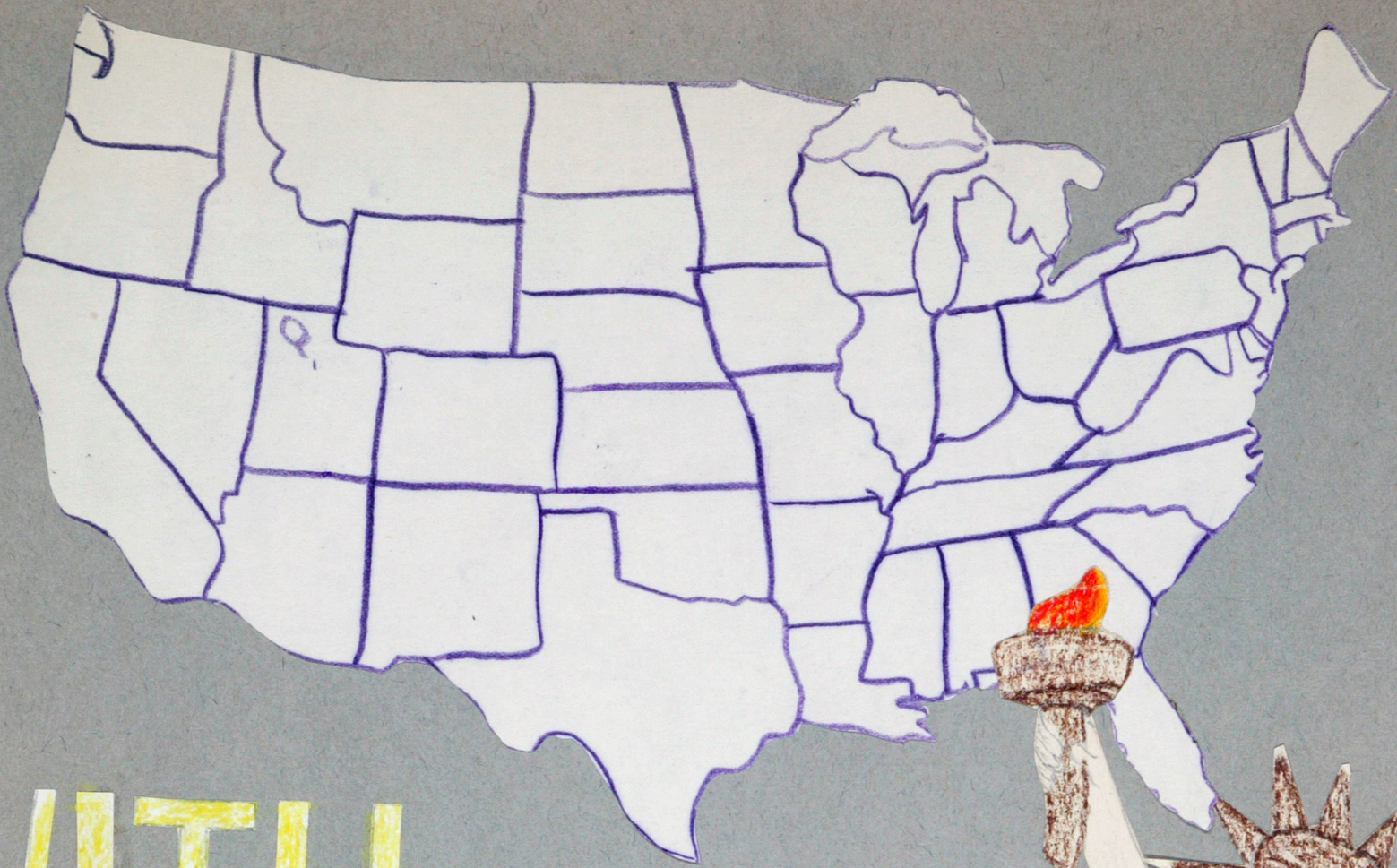
