We are only a small Rural town with a three teacher Elementary school of about 80 total enrollment. We have a Post Office that gets its mail from a Rural carrier on a route from the County Seat(Stigler).

Our students of High school level are transferred and transported to school at the County Seat(Stigler) . Our Post Office does not handle Bonds. A great number of our male citizens are off working in defense industry and are purchasing Bonds there.

Our Program caused the sale of all the Stamps our Postoffice had on hand and several more could have been sold.

The Total Sale of Stamps from Jan. 1, 1943 to close of Business Jan. 6, 1943 was
