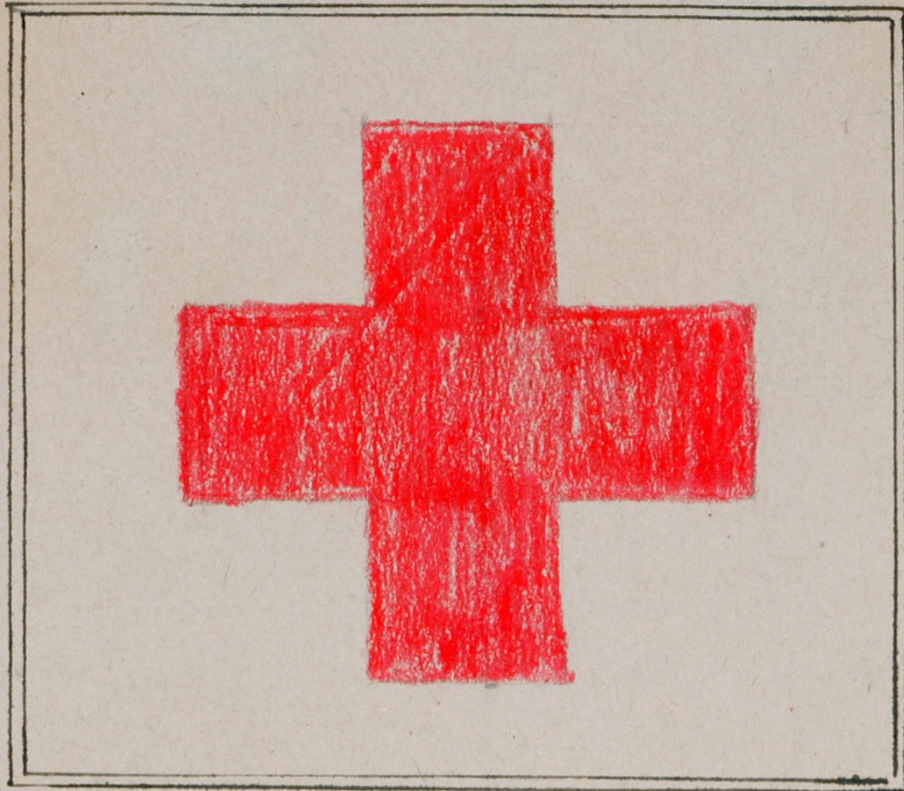

## Our Scrap Drive

One Thursday afternoon in October the whole school was dismissed for the purpose of collecting and assembling the scrap of the community.

We were glad to do this for our country and hope that we shall be able to do much more.



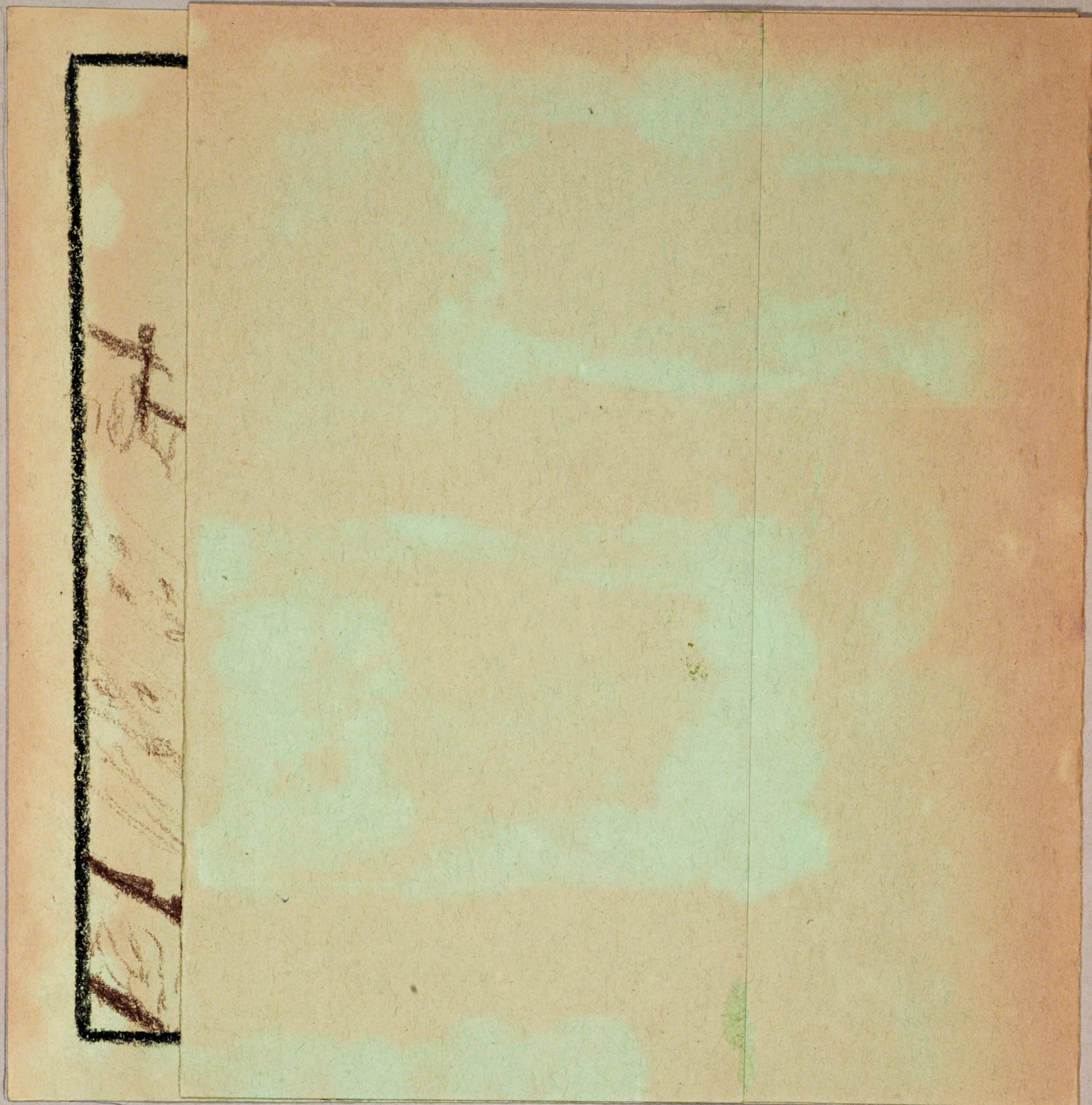
