Vinco School At War

November

THE VINCO SCHOOL CHILDREN have a very satisfactory report to make concerning their work for November in the "National School at War" program.

They found the Vinco community to consist of a population of seventy nine (79). The children have called upon each person and have asked them to help make the community one hundred percent owners of Stamps and Bonds by January 1. The community has responded with

splendid co-operation.

Each school child buys and sells to the community Defense Stamps each week. The children call themselves Stamp Collectors. They collect the money and deliver Stamps regularly once each week. The collector buying and selling the most Stamps each month is awarded a free Stamp. Betty Lou Dilliner won the free Stamp for November.

16 percent of the Community own Bonds.

58 percent of the Community own either Bonds or Stamps.

100 percent of the School Children own Stamps.

THE VINCO SCHOOL CHILDREN make the following report on their activities in the School at War Program. They have called on this community's 78 members regularly once each week. Booklets are being made to distribute to all members of the community who are buying Stamps and Bonds. These 60 members are called "Active Soldiers On The Home Front" and the amount of money invested in Stamps and Bonds determine each Active Soldier's rank.

These booklets are prepared during the pennmanship period. They contain news of the members of the 100 percent club. A weekly radio program of all favorite programs is included in these booklets.

All members have donated canceled stamps to send to a Boy's school in England. Iva Lillian won a free War Stamp for reporting the largest amount invested in Stamps and Bonds for January. She also won a free War Stamp for reporting the most new members to the 100 percent club for January.

Vinco School At War

136,824 Pounds Of Scrap Sold To City Dealer

Students at Vinco
On Duration Basis.

Total scrap handled by the one scrap dealer in Stillwater during the first eight days of the Newspapers' United Scrap drive mounted to 136,824 pounds at noon Wednesday.

Other sections of Payne county are piling up a record surpassing this tonnage by far, since other dealers are operating in Cushing, Yale, Ripley and other smaller communities and in old oil field areas are buying thousands of pounds daily. County total, which reached 193,000 pounds last Friday night, is expected to reach over the half million pound mark this week.

Students Get Scrap

The drive is going on all over the county with renewed efforts. School children are getting in record amounts individually, industries are adding their obsolete and unused machinery, and householders in the cities and farmers everywhere are scouring their premises for material that may be brought in to go into manufacture of war materials.

"The Vinco Scrappers" is a new club organized by the students of Vinco school for the duration of the war. Mrs. Sylvia Thompson, teacher, said Wednesday.

Visit Every Family

Committees have been appointed to call on all families every two days for all articles of metal, rubber, paper, fats and other articles that may be scrapped for war use.

The club meets every two days and members answer the roll call by giving the total number of war savings stamps bought and the number bought since last meeting.

Scrap of all descriptions is being brought to the school and many patrons are giving receipts of scrap sold to the school.
