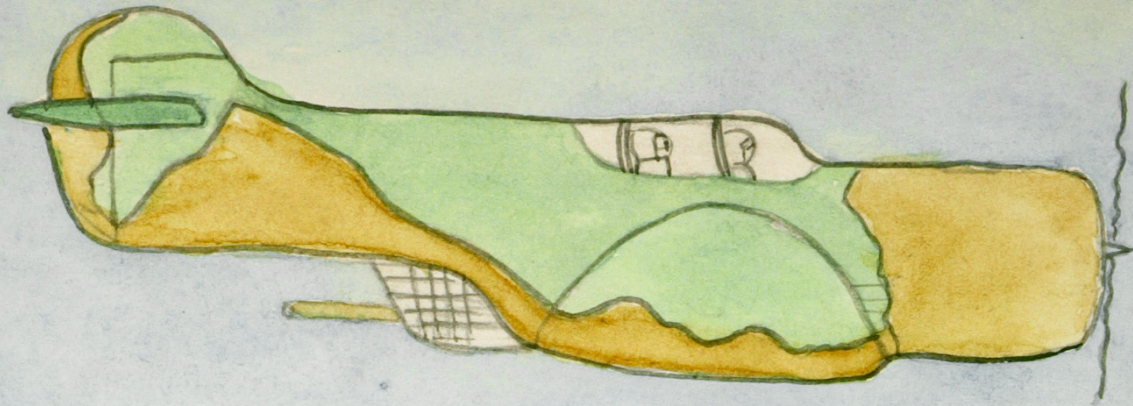

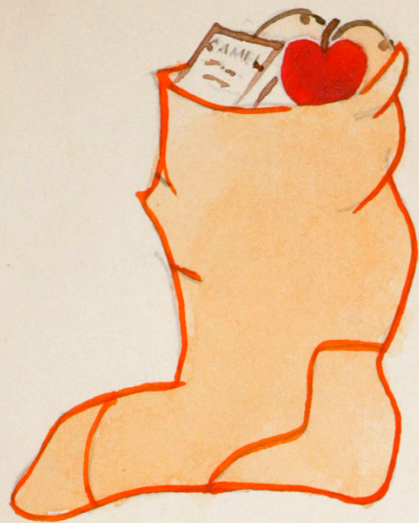

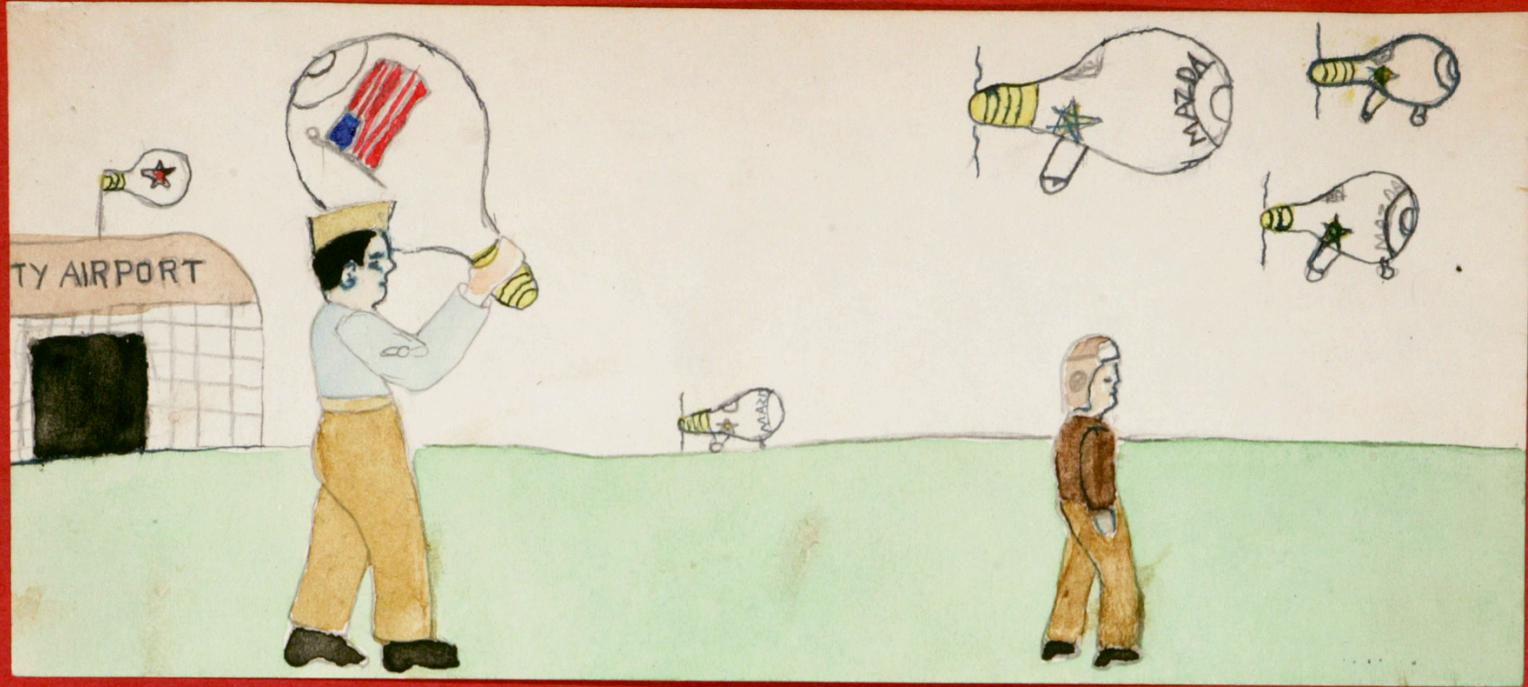


CHRISTMAS SOCKS FOR THE ARMY

Filling Christmas Stockings

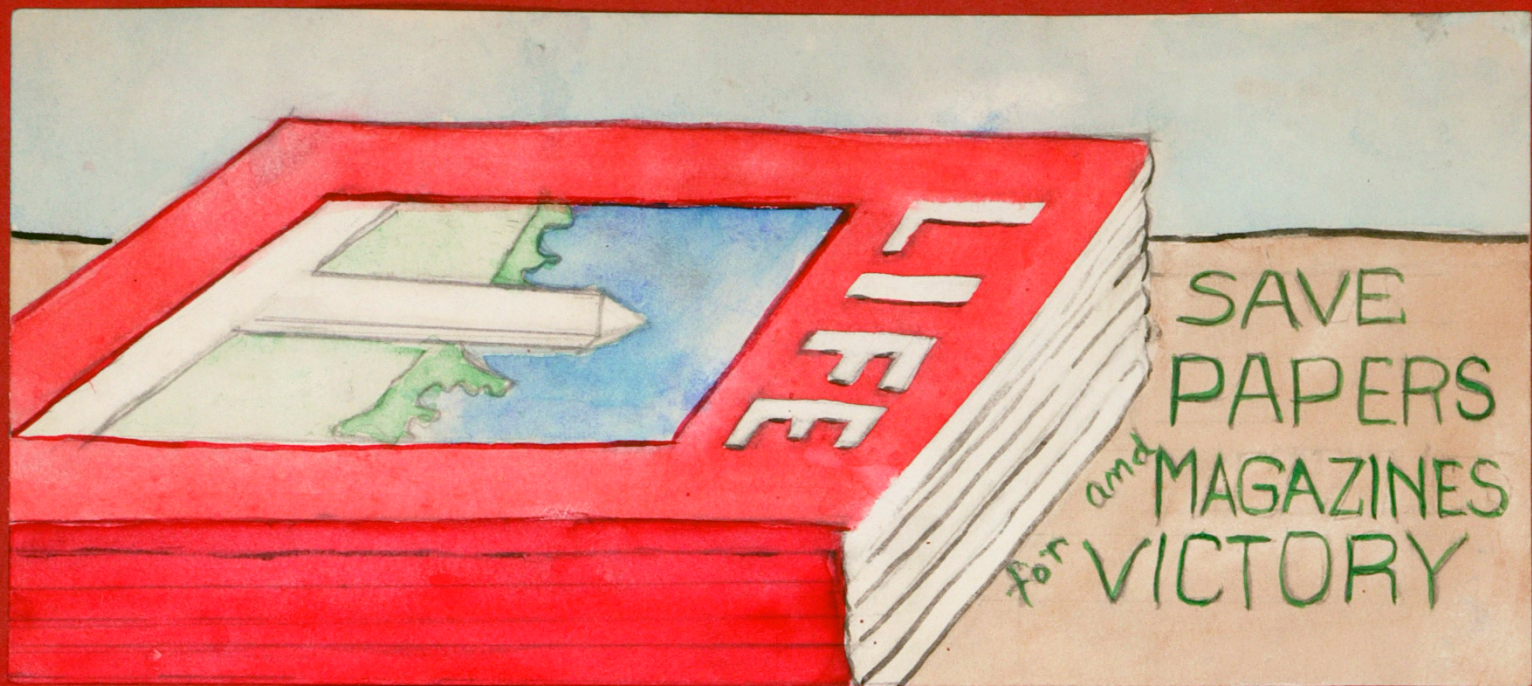
