FIRSTYEAR SEMINARS

In-person sessions

- Purpose: Become more effective at searching for and analyzing information using a popular search engine, utilize fachecking strategies for information found online, and recognize social and ethical implications of information systems.
- Design: Adapted from<u>Googling Google: Search Engines as Market</u> <u>Actors</u> by Jacob Berg (available on Project CORA) and incorporating Mike Caulfield's "four moves" from<u>Veb Literacy for Student Fact</u> <u>Checkers</u>(OA text)
- Use: 8/13 sections utilized new session outline, reaching 248/504 students





INSTRUCTOR FEEDBACK

- 100% of responding instructors said they were likely to incorporate a library activity into their classes again
- When asked what they found useful about the activity or library session, comments included:
 - Scavenger hunt: interactive, engaging, accessible
 - In-class session: focus on credibility, relevance, applicability
 - Online tutorials: watch at their own pace, explored variety of library services

- First unit (8 weeks): Archival/digital collection research
