Professor R. H. Records submitted the report of the Senate Research Committee: (As the report was rather long, and some of the points in the report were not quite clear in the minds of the senators, a motion was adopted requesting the Secrotary to mail a copy of Professor Record's report to each member of the Senate for consideration at our next regular meeting. SEE COPY OF REPORT ATTACHED.)
On March 29, 1943 the Committee on Curriculun and University Standards recommended oight rules for conducting examinations. These rules were presented to the General Faculty at their regular meeting on April 15 by Professor J. O. Hassler, Chairman of the Committee on Curriculum and University Standards. The General Faculty rejected most all of these rules, and they finally voted to refer the whole question back to the University Senate for further consideration. The Senate referred the question back to the Committee on Curriculum and University Standards.

Professor Hassler raised the question on the floor: "Should graduating seniors be excused from final examinations; and if so, under what conditions?" Motion carried to the offect that this question be referred to the Committee on Curriculum and University Standards and that they present a report at the next regular meeting.

The Chairman announced that the next meeting would be on November 29.

## REPORT OF THE SENATE RESEARCH COMMITTEE

The Senate Research Committee has met and adopted the following recommendations:

1. That the Faculty Research Fund be augmented at least ten times what it is at present.
(a) In 1939-1940 it was ${ }_{k l} 1,000$. This year it is less.
(b) The University of Oklahoma Medical School was given the sum of $\$ 20,000$ for research during the last biennium, which was cut to $\$ 17,000$ during the second year.
2. The cominittee approves the Meacham-Cross agreement in respect to teaching loads for Jnivers ty instructors who perform research in the University of Cklanoma Fesearch Institute.
(a) The average texching load in the science departments shall be regarded as twelve hours each semester.
(b) In figuring the teaching load of staff members, credit for directing master $s$ and contoral theses shall be computed as follows:
(i) For each mastex's student actively engaged in research, the instructor shall receive one hour teaching credit each semester, except that the maximun for any cne master's candidate shall be two credit hours.
(ii) For each doctoral candidate engaged in research, the instructor shall receive two hours teaching credit for each semester, except that the maximum for any one candidate shall be eight credit hours.
(c) That the principles of this agreement be extended throughout the University.
3. The committee recommends that funds be made available to defray the cost of publishing reprints of articles previously published.
4. The committee recommends that the Sooner magagine, as is the case with Ohio State University's alumni bulletin, be used as a medium for listing the research needs of departments and individuals in the University. For Examples:
(a) A rare book
(b) A piece of engineering equipment
(c) A small money gift by an alumnus to complete gathering data, or to make documentary material available, or to make gifts of old newspapers, letters, journals, diaries, etc.
5. That all the research committees be consolidated into one committee; that it be empowered to consider petitions for grants and allocate funds to those whose requests have been approved.
(a) That the personnel of the four research committees of this institution meet with the deans and the President to devise a plan that will insure a single, representative, all-University research committee.
