## JOURNAL OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE November 29, 1943, 4 p.m. Monnet Hall 101

The Senate met in regular session with President Brandt, Chairman, presiding.

The Committee on Curriculum and University Standards reported that Professor J. O. Hassler had been elected Chairman, and that Dean J. P. Blickensderfer had been elected Secretary.

The Committee on Organization of Departments, Schools, and Divisions reported that Professor I. J. Sollenberger had been elected Chairman.

A motion was passed to consider the report of the Committee on Research as presented by Professor Ralph H. Records, item at a time. (See original report presented by Professor Records which is attached to the  $J_0$ urnal of the University Senate, November 8.)

Action taken on the report of the Committee on Research was as follows:

Item "1 was approved.

Item "2" was referred back to the committee to re-state it in such a way that a professor could not be entirely relieved of his teaching load on the grounds that all of his time is taken up directing research work.

Item "3" was amended and approved to read as follows: "The committee recommends that funds be made available to defray the cost of publishing reprints from scholarly publications of national importance--not retroactive."

Item "4" was approved.

Item "5" was not approved.

The Committee on Curriculum and University Standards made the following recommendation:

"The Committee on Curriculum and University Standards recommends unanimously that the practice of excusing seniors from their last session or semester final examinations be discontinued." APPROVED.

Lots were drawn by the Senators elected last spring from the College of Arts and Sciences to see who is to serve the two-year unexpired term of Dean R. J. Dangerfield. Professor Leslie Hewes drew this term.

Lots were drawn by the Senators elected last spring from the General Faculty to see who is to serve the one-year unexpired term of Professor A. B. Sears. Miss Dora McFarland drew the number to serve this one year term. They also drew lots to see who is to serve the two-year unexpired term of Professor Findley Weaver. Professor C. E. Springer drew the number to serve this two-year term. (All other Senators elected last spring from all colleges were elected to serve a three year term.)

Professor Newton suggested that the length of time for giving a final examination be made longer than two hours for a three credit hour course. (The Chairman referred the suggestion to the Committee on Curriculum and University Standards.)

A proposal was made to create a separate School of Architecture. (Referred to the Committee on Organization of Departments, Schools, and Divisions.)

A proposal was made to make a study of "Facilities for Faculty Research." (Referred to the Committee on Research.)

Two closely related proposals for study were made as follows:

- (1) That a study be made of the Year-Around Operation of the University of Oklahoma During Peace Time.
- (2) That a study be made of Faculty Leaves and Vacations. (Both proposals referred to the Committee on Coordination.)

A proposal was made to make a study of "Group Insurance and Teacher Retirement." (Referred to the Committee on Faculty Personnel.)

A proposal was made to make a study as a "Basis for Salary Increases and Promotion of Faculty Members." (Referred to the Committee on Faculty Personnel.)

A proposal was made to make a study of "The Relation of the Cost of Living to the Salary Structure of the University of Oklahoma." (Referred to the Administration -- in turn to be referred to Dean Cheadle.)

Monday, January 31, 1944, 4:10 p.m. was set as the date for the next regular meeting of the University Senate.
