## JOURNAL OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE May 12, 1947 4:10 p.m. Monnet Hall, Room 107

The Senate met in special session with Dr. Royden Dangerfield acting as chairman. The purpose of the meeting was to consider the reports of the Journal Committee on the progress in complying the University Statutes on the following titles:

TITLE VI CURRICULA AND SCHOLARSHIP STANDARDS

> TITLE VII RESEARCH

TITLE X
STUDENT AFFAIRS

TITLE XII
UTILITIES, BUILDINGS, GROUNDS
AND AUXILIARY FUNCTIONS

The essential action on these reports was as follows:

On Title VI, Curricula and Scholarship Standards, the entire of Article 4, "Students absences from Classes" was referred to the Senate Committee on Curricula and University Standards to be redrafted. Article 5, section 4, "Flunk Fees" was amended to read, "Fee for Repeated Instruction" and to read the same as is found in the University Catalog.

Article 5, section 4, Military Drill, with a minimum of three hours per week, shall be compulsory for all first and second year male students, subject to such exemptions, regulations, and provisions as may from time to time be established, (Regents-6-30-19) was amended to read as follows:

Section 5, Military Drill or Naval Science.

(a) Military or Naval Science shall be compulsory for all first and second year male students, subject to such exemptions, regulations, and provisions as may from time to time be established.

Several rules and regulations on Curricula and Scholarship Standards which from time to time in the past were made by the "Administrative Council," which council does not now exist, were approved by the Senate and agreed that in the statutes that are being complied will carry the citation, "University Senate, May 12, 1947."

Title VII, Research was considered and approved with the exception of Articles 3,  $l_{\rm t}$ , and 5 which were referred to the Senate Research Committee to be redrafted.

Article X, Student Affairs was approved without any changes.

Article XII, Utilities, Buildings, Grounds, and Auxiliary Functions was approved with the exception of Article 4, on University Housing which was referred to the Senate Committee, Utilization and Development of University Buildings and Grounds.
