Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.
The Senate elected standing committees as shown on the separate page, attached to these minutes. The first named member of each committee was requested to call the first meeting of the committee and elect their own Chairman.

The Charter of the General Faculty, as revised last spring, reads as follows in part: "The General Faculty of the University of Oklahoma is composed of the President, the Deans and Directors of Schools, the Director of Student Affairs, the Counselor of Men and Women, Professors, Associate Professors, Assistant Professors, and Instructors,------------.

The question was raised as to whether or not "Deans" as referred to here, means only the Deans of the various schools and colleges, or does it include all Deans. Motion was made and carried that it was meant to include all Deans.

The Charter further provides that other employees of the University concerned with policy making, may be admitted to membership by election of the Faculty upon nomination by the President and approval by the Senate. Accordingly, President Cross nominated and the Senate approved the following to become members of the General Faculty. (The President requested that these approvals become a part of our policy in the future.)

1. The Financial Vice-president of the University.
2. The Comptroller of the University.
3. The Assistant Comptroller of the University.
4. The Dean of Admissions and Records.
5. The Director of Registration.
6. The Director of Admissions.
7. The Recorder and Office Manager, Office of Admissions and Records.
8. The Director of Extension Division.
9. The Assistant Director of the Extension Division.
10. The Director of the Student Health Service.
11. The Director of the University Press.
12. The Assistant Editor, Publishing Division, University of Okla homa Press.
13. Sales Manager, Publishing Division, University of Oklahoma Press.
14. Service Manager, Sales Division, University of Oklahoma Press.
15. Superintendent, Printing Division, University of Oklahoma Press.
16. The Director of the University of Oklahoma Research Institute.
17. Superintendent of the Physical Plant.
18. The Secretary of the University.

Note: It is, of course, to be clearly understood that membership in the General Faculty in no way affects tenure. Tenure is accorded only by special action of the Board of Regents.

A request was presented to the University Senate to create a separate "Department of Geography" in the College of Arts and Sciences. Also, a request was made to create a separate "Department of Statics" in the College of Business Administration. These two requests were referred to the Senate Committee on "Organization of Departments, Schools, and Divisions," for consideration and report at the next meeting.

Professor I. N. Morgan, Director of Publications, presented a report to the Senate on all "Course Changes" that have been made since the last report. His report was approved.

At the meeting of the University Senate last Nay 26, 1947, the Senate approved the following rules and regulations concerning late enrollments and late withdrawals as a part of a report made by the Senate Committee on "Curriculum and University standards."

A student who enrolls after the beginning of a semester shall not be permitted to carry a full academic load, and no student shall be permitted to enroll in the University later than three weeks after the close of the official registration period for that semester.

No student shall be permitted to withdraw from a class later than the end of the twelfth week of the semester.

The Senate voted to have the Secretary send a copy of the Committee's report on "Student's Absences from Classes, Late Enrollments, and Late Withdrawals from Classes," to the President of the University for his approval and the approval of the Board of Regents, if the President thinks that stop is necessary.

Moved and carried that the Senate's "Committee on Committees" be elected at the last meeting of the University Senate in the Spring in order that they in turn might make their nominations for all standing committees of the University Senate at the first meeting in September.
