To the University Senate:

The special committee, appointed to plan a university calendar for a five-year period, herewith submits calendars for the academic years, 1948-49, 1949-50, 1950-51, 1951-52, and 1952-53.

The committee recommends:

1. That a date fixed in accordance with the 80% attendance rule be listed on the University Calendar as the latest possible date for enrollment during the semester. (This does not apply to adjustments in the course of students already enrolled).

2. That home-coming be a holiday. The specific Saturday in 1951 and in 1952 is not named because the football schedules for these years are not available.

3. That a Thanksgiving recess of three class days; and Easter recess of four class days; and a semester examination period of seven days be scheduled.

4. That a study be made to determine whether we should, or should not, have a pre-advisement period.

5. That approximately the middle of April be designated as the "Final date for filing application for degree and paying diploma fee."
