Dean Snyder, Chairman of the Curriculum Committee, presented a report concerning an amendment to the Article establishing and activating the Council on Instruction. After Dean Snyder proposed an amendment, several suggestions were made. Following an amendment to the Committee's proposed amendment, the following amendment was "Section 3Al, be amended to read: The Council on Instruction shall make its recommendations to the College Faculties concerned on all proposals for the establishment, or abolition of colleges, schools, departments of instruction, curricula, and degrees. The Council shall have the right to present its case before the faculty which is considering the decisions of the Council on Instruction. "Section 3All1, remove last sentence on appeals. "Add new paragraph 4BIV, as follows: When the college faculty disagrees with the recommendations of the Council on Instruction, the matter shall be referred to the University Senate." Another report by the Curriculum Committee concerned "Early Final Examinations." The committee recommended: "Final examinations for the spring semester of the academic year 1949-50 will be held from Friday, May 27, through Friday, June 3. The Summer Session final examinations will be held Thursday, August 3, and Friday, August 4, instead of August 4 and 5 as now announced." A motion that the recommendation be accepted was made and approved.

Vice President Franklin proposed the following resolution:

"The official method of weighing the final grades of the University of Oklahoma shall be changed from A-3; B-2; C-1; D-0; F-0; to A-4; B-3; C-2; D-1; F-0; E-0. This method shall be effective for all students who matriculate in the University at the beginning of the first semester of the academic year 1950-51."

It was approved. A motion that the grade of "I" be omitted in the resolution was made and approved.

At the September 29, 1949, meeting, the Secretary was instructed to write a letter of thanks to Professor E.E. Hatfield for his seven years' faithful service as Secretary of the University Senate. The following letter was mailed:

Dear Professor Hatfield:

Your seven years' loyal service as Secretary of the University Senate has been an important part in its successful work.
