PLANS FOR THE CELEBRATION OF THE
COMPLETION OF SIXTY YEAR'S SERVICE BY THE
UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA

Dr. L. H. Snyder gave a report as follows:

Tentative Plans for the Celebration of the Completion of Sixty Year's Service by the University of Oklahoma and the Tenth Year of the Presidency of George L. Cross.

One week of formal exercises, probably the first week in February 1953, as follows:

1. Research, Science and the Professions Day. Dedicate Home Economics Building and Gittinger Hall. Evening presentation of the DeGolyer Lecture on the History of Science, by an outstanding speaker.

2. Business and Engineering Day. Dedicate Aeronautical Engineering Building. Evening lecture by an outstanding industrialist.

3. Education Day. Dedicate Education Building. Special invitations to college presidents, secondary school administrators, and O. E. A. Evening lecture on some phase of higher education.

4. Student Services Day. A very special program is planned for this day and will be presented in detail for approval later. In addition, the Committee suggests that a memorial stone be erected by the faculty at the south end of the South Oval, on which would be inscribed the rededication of the faculty to the University, to the principles and philosophy of University education, and to the state of Oklahoma and the Southwest. A sub-committee composed of the Boyd Professors and Research Professors is preparing a suggested text for the stone.

5. The University, the State and the Nation Day. Dedicate Cross Center. Have open house everywhere. Dismiss afternoon classes; invite parents, legislature, government officials, etc. Evening banquet at which President Cross has been asked to speak on his philosophy of university education and administration.

The remarkable DeGolyer collection on the history of science will be on exhibition all week, with a special exhibition list.

Professor Marrs made a motion that the University Senate indicate approval of the tentative plans presented by Dr. Snyder. The motion was seconded and passed.
