ACADEMIC STANDARDS -- Maintenance of "C" Average XStatement from President Cross to the Chairman of the University Senate

January 10, 1960

I should like to discuss with the Senate at its next meeting
the regulation, recommended by the several College faculties
some time ago, that would provide for probationary status and
subsequent suspension for a student who fails to maintain a c-
average.

Senate Action

President Cross was present to discuss this matter on January 25. He
indicated that consideration of the problem was initiated in the University College
Council and that it was then considered by the several college faculties. He
pointed up a number of problems indicating that the full implications of the
regulation might appropriately be held in abeyance.

Academic Standards -- Maintenance of "C" Average -- continued

Following a relatively brief discussion of the problem, Dr. Ewing moved that the matter be referred to the appropriate committee for consideration. His motion was seconded and passed.

The matter was immediately referred to the Committee on Academic Standards of the University Senate.

UNIVERSITY CALENDAR

Statement from the Committee on Academic Standards

January 11, 1960

Dear Dr. Porter:

The Committee on Academic Standards has developed policies for the preparation of University Calendars during recent years. President Cross approved the University Calendar for 1960-61 with the understanding that certain aspects of the calendar be given further consideration by the Senate. In this connection a representative of this committee met with the Dean's Council on December 2 and during this committee meeting the following motion was passed unanimously:

"The Council of Deans express to the Faculty Senate the feeling that the enrollment period for fall 1960 must be moved forward one day and ended one day earlier because of the Northwestern game."

Under this proposal, the freshman period would begin on Monday, September 19, (as previously agreed); the registration period would be held from Tuesday, Sept. 20 through Friday, Sept. 23, (instead of Wednesday, the 21st, through Saturday, the 24th). There would be no enrollment activities on Saturday. Classes would begin on Monday, September 26th (as previously agreed).

The committee concurs in this view and recommends this change to the Senate.

Senate Action

Dr. Brixey read the statement from the Committee on Academic Standards relative to the University Calendar and requested consideration of it.

FACULTY PROBLEMS

Dr. Crosser, Chairman of the Committee on Faculty Personnel, introduced three related problems for discussion. The problems involved:

1. Salary payments for faculty members who become permanently disabled.
2. Pay for teaching an overload because of the loss of a colleague.
3. Payments to retired faculty members who obtain employment after retirement from the University.

No action was taken on these matters. They will be studied further by the Committee on Faculty Personnel.

ADJOURNMENT
