## SENATE INFORMATION

An organizational meeting of the Senate Committee on Academic Standards was held on October 21, 1964. Dr. Marion C. Phillips was elected chairman of the committee.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND ROTC 

Dr. Kondonassis, Chairman of the Senate Committee on Courses and Curricula, reported orally that the Committee is continuing to study the problems of Physical Education and ROTC. Additional materials are being gathered and meetings held in the expectation that a formal report will be ready for the Senate meeting to be held on January 25, 1965.

STUDENT CHEATING ✓

Explanatory Comment

From the floor of the Senate, Dr. Phelps called attention to a University of Oklahoma Interoffice Communication to all faculty members from President Cross. The communication dealt with Student Cheating and was issued on October 27, 1964.

Dr. Phelps expressed concern about the last paragraph in the communication, which reads as follows:

Where a student is failed in a course because of cheating, but no further punishment follows, the permanent record of the student shall not show the cause of failure.

Dr. Phelps questioned the desirability and appropriateness of the statement in that the permanent record card would not disclose the cause of the failure not the full status of the student.

Senate Action

Dr. Duncan moved that this matter be referred to the appropriate committee for consideration and a report. His motion was seconded and passed.

The matter was immediately referred, by the Chairman of the University Senate, to the Senate Committee on Academic Standards.

RECIPROCAL WAIVER OF OUT-OF-STATE FEES ✓

Explanatory Comment

From the floor of the Senate, Dr. Campbell raised a question relative to the possibility of waiving, on a reciprocal arrangement, among the Big-Eight institutions, the payment of out-of-state tuition fees by the sons and daughters of faculty members in those institutions.

Dr. Duncan moved that this matter be investigated by the appropriate committee of the University Senate. His motion was seconded and passed.

The matter was immediately referred, by the Chairman of the University Senate, to the Senate Committee on University Organization, Budgets, and Publications.
