## Explanatory Comment

On June 8, 1964, President Cross requested that the University Senate consider matters relating to general faculty membership for administrative officers (see Pages 3 and 4, Journal of the University Senate, September 28, 1964).

In response to President Cross' memorandum concerning faculty status for Administrative Officers, the Committee recommends that the following persons be granted status as members of the General Faculty:

The Committee further recommends that the Charter of the Government of the University be amended to provide for General Faculty membership for all Administrative Officers by inserting the words "Administrative Officers", in line 12 of the University Charter. The full statement as amended would read:

The general faculty of the university is composed of all full-time university faculty members with the rank of instructor or above, the president and the vice-presidents of the university, the deans and the associate and assistant deans, other administrative officers, and such persons who have been or may be nominated by the president and approved by the University Senate.

## Senate Action

Dr. Eriksen, as chairman of the Senate Comittee on Faculty Personnel, presented the foregoing report. Following considerable discussion of it, he moved adoption by the Senate of the recommendations relative to administrative officers. His motion was seconded.

Professor Jentz then moved that the committee report be acted upon in terms of its parts. His motion was seconded and passed.

Dr. Rohrbaugh moved that the University Senate approve the five persons named in the report for status as members of the General Faculty. His motion was seconded and passed. Thus, the five persons listed in the first paragraph on the preceding page of this Journal will be recommended to President Cross as people who should be granted status as members of the General Faculty.

Dr. Turkington moved that the second portion of the committee report (involving the insertion of the words "administrative officers" in line 12 of the University Charter) be approved by the University Senate. His motion was seconded. Following additional discussion, relative to the possibility that this would through the years mean that large numbers of officers would become members of the General Faculty, the motion was put to a vote and it FAILED to pass.

## Explanatory Comment

Dr. Wilcox, on January 25, raised for consideration certain matters relating to the retirement of faculty members. Referral was to the Senate Committee on Faculty Personnel.

## Report of Senate Committee on Faculty Personnel



February 22, 1965
The following recommendations are made in consideration (1) for long service to the University, and (2) as an inducement to employment at the University:
(1) The Committee recommends that a full-time faculty member receive credit toward University of Oklahoma retirement at the University of Oklahoma for prior services at any acrediced institution of higher edwation. Credit for prior service will be granted up to a maximum of five years on the basis of one year's credit for each four full (nine or more months) years of prior service.

The Committee further recommends that at the completion of 25 years of service at the University of Oklahoma, including prior service credit at other accredited institutions of higher learning, a University employee's entitlement shall accrue at the rate of one-half of one percent for each year of additional. service.

## Faculty Retirement - continued

(2) The Committee recommends that the Senate ask the President's Office to consider and advise the Senate on the feasibility of initiating a plan whereby the purchasing power of retired faculty members be kept relatively stable by varying the amount received each year through retirement funds in accordance with an appropriate commodity index scale.

## Senate Action

Dr. Eriksen presented the foregoing report. He moved that the recommendtions in the two paragraphs under (1) be approved. His motion was seconded.

Considerable discussion followed relative to the meaning of the term "accredited" and whether an individual would be given prior service credit for teaching in another institution that was not accredited when he taught there but was accredited when he retired at the University of Oklahoma. It was agreed that these and other such questions would have to be resolved at another time and as a formalized plan was developed. The motion was then passed.

Dr. Eriksen moved approval of the recommendation (2) in the foregoing report. His motion was seconded and passed.

REAPPORTIONMENT OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE


Reapportionment of the membership of the University Senate should be considered by the General Faculty in the Fall of 1965. The Senate Committee on University Organization, Budget, and Publications is now preparing a reapportionment plan that can be recommended by the University Senate for approval by the General Faculty.

Dr. Phelps, chairman of the Committee, presented orally a progress report and raised several questions which must be clarified before the reapportionment plan is considered by the University Senate.

## ADJOURNMENT
