4.10 FINAL EXAM PREPARATION PERIOD

Pre-finals week will be defined as the seven calendar days before the first day of finals. Faculty may cover new course material throughout this week.

4.10.1 Student-Faculty Policies and Information

- (A) Assignments, examinations, or projects worth less than 10 percent combined total of a student's grade may be assigned at any time prior to pre-finals week and may be due during pre-finals week. However, no assignments, examinations, or projects may be due on the last two days of pre-finals week. Quizzes may be given during pre-finals week, but cannot account for more than 3% combined total of the final grade. Exams may not be given during pre-finals week.
- (B) Assignments, take-home examinations, in-class examinations, or projects worth more than 10 percent of a student's grade must be scheduled at least 30 days prior to the first day of finals and must be due or given prior to pre-finals week. Any assignment that is to take the entire semester to complete may be accepted or presented during the first three weekdays of pre-finals week provided the syllabus explicitly states that the assignment can be turned in prior to pre-finals week. In-class presentation of semester assignments due before pre-finals week may be scheduled for any day other than the last two days of pre-finals week.
- (C) Special case deviations cases deviating from this the Final Exam Preparation Period policy must be clearly stated in the course syllabus and approved by the chair of the department through which the course is offered. If the professor is the chair of the department, the professor must have these special cases approved by the dean of the college in which said department resides. If the professor is the dean of the college in which the course is taught, the professor must have these special cases approved by the Senior Vice President and Provost.
- (D) Special requests made by a student for an extension of assignment deadlines into pre-finals week may be granted subject to the discretion of the instructor.

(E) Final Exam Preparation Period policies must be placed in the course syllabus underneath the University Policy section.

This policy applies only to 16-week courses during the spring and fall semesters.

This policy excludes make-up assignments, make-up tests, and laboratory examinations. It also does not apply to classes meeting one day a week for more than one hour with a start time before 5:00 p.m. and evening classes. or to classes without a university-scheduled final exam time during finals week.

All University laboratory classes and graduate courses are exempt from this policy.

No <u>University of Oklahoma Student Association (UOSA) organization</u> <u>Student Government Association (SGA)</u> <u>Registered Student Organizations (RSO's)</u> may hold meetings, banquets, or receptions or sponsor or participate in any activity, program, or related function that requires student participation during prefinals week.

Violations to this policy should be reported to the chair of the department in which the course is taught or, in special circumstances, to the dean of the college and may be grounds for grade appeal.

This policy shall remain in force until reviewed no sooner than 2014.

The Information Technology Council (ITC) has the advisory responsibility for the policy and planning aspects of information technology and resources on the Norman campus.

These technologies and resources include, but are not limited to the following: Networking; research and creative activity computing; instructional computing and technology, administrative computing; voice, video, and data communications; library resources and services; and analog and digital data storage, retrieval, and transport. The Council considers these technologies and resources from the lowest level of transport through their delivery and use, the degree to which campus audiences are both aware of and able to use them efficiently and effectively, and the budget decisions involved in their purchase and upkeep.

The Council advises and makes recommendations to the President, the Senior Vice President and Provost, the Vice President for Information Technology and Chief Information Officer, the Vice President for Research, and the Vice President for Administrative Affairs. It solicits, receives, and reviews pertinent recommendations of other councils and committees. It provides for input from all areas of the campus through the creation of standing committees that deal with topics of general concern. It constitutes task forces to deal with specific issues or, through other formal reporting channels to respond to the concerns of administrative offices, academic units, and councils or committees. The chair of the Council shall also report regularly to the Faculty Senate and serve as an ex-officio member of the Executive Committee of the Senate.

In carrying out these responsibilities, the Council shall:

- 1. Formulate statements of general policy related to information technology and resources.
- 2. Recommend, advise on, and monitor progress towards long-range strategic planning for information technology and resources.
- 3. Recommend, advise on, and monitor progress towards the improvement of campus information technology literacy through the training of campus personnel.
- 4. Review actual and proposed changes in the administrative structures that support information technology and resources.
- Serve as a forum for the interaction of campus service providers and their user communities by monitoring the various aspects of campus usage, and by periodically soliciting the feedback of users.
- 6. Undertake other activities it considers appropriate to foster and promote the effective and efficient use of information technologies and resources.

Committee Membership:

Membership: Shall consist of the following:

- 5 Faculty Members: Selected by the Faculty Senate and serving 3 year terms (terms to be staggered)
- 4 Members from the Administration: With 1 representative appointed by each of the following: the President, the Provost, the Vice President for Administrative Affairs, and the Vice President for Research.
- 3 Staff Members: Selected by the Staff Senate, and serving 3 year terms (terms to be staggered)
- 3 Students: 2 appointed by Student Congress and 1 appointed by the Graduate Student Senate, and serving 1 year terms with re-appointment allowed

VP of IT: Ex-officio and nonvoting

At the conclusion of each academic year the Council will elect a Chair for the subsequent academic year. At the first meeting of each year the Council will elect a Chair-elect to serve as Chair for the following year and as an aide to the current Chair.
