Alternative Textbook Grant Applications Open In January

Since 2014, the <u>Alternative Textbook Grant</u> has saved OU students millions of dollars in course material costs. OU Libraries awards up to \$2,500 for successful applications, and some colleges award discretionary funds to supplement the total award amount. OU Libraries provides the grant to incentivize instructors to abandon commercial course materials in favor of those available to their students for low or no cost.
