Department of Education Approves Public Generative AI

The U.S. Department of Education has approved the use of public generative AI software. The department is also developing other AI efforts, including working with the vendor community on an enterprise generative AI platform and developing comprehensive AI guidance. The investment in the technology is notable for the agency, which has, at this point, only publicly disclosed <u>two AI use cases</u> in its required inventory. <u>Read more.</u>

Data Management Plan Tool for Funding

<u>Registration required.</u> This workshop is an active learning "work-along" overview of the web portal <u>DMPTool</u> for creating a Data Management Plan (DMP). More U.S. funding and foundation agencies are requiring researchers to submit a research DMP for preservation and sharing of their digital outputs as part of their submitted proposal. In this workshop, learners will learn the basics of creating a DMP using the on-line DMPTool which guides researchers though a funding agency's requirements.

<u>Registration required.</u> Many tools for the analysis of your digital assets may require knowledge of the Unix Shell, referred to sometimes as the command line. This
