

News and Announcements

Alternative Textbook Grant Publications

Two new textbooks have been published thanks to University Libraries' Alternative Textbook Grant:

- Navigating the Arts Lucia Colombari (Assistant Professor of Art History) and Catherine Juliano-Lykins (PhD Student in Art History)

 Navigating the Arts delves into the visual elements and principles of design throughout art history and is tailored for classroom use. It aims to deepen students' understanding of these concepts and their application across different artistic forms, fostering critical thinking and visual literacy. The accessible language, logical structure, clear objectives, and wealth of examples and images make this journal an ideal tool for everyone interested in developing class discussions on how to understand and interpret images.
- Introduction to Process Simulation with Aspen Plus Jude Okolie (Assistant Professor of Engineering Pathways) and Brooke E. Rogachuk (Research Assistant)

This book was written as an educational material to help Chemical/ Environmental/Process Engineering students working on their capstone project to learn more about process design. Capstone courses are designed to help students understand process design, preliminary economic assessment and process plant optimization. The book delves into the fundamentals of process design and offers practical examples for easy understanding. This book was used with ENGR 3440, a mentored research course on process design at the University of Oklahoma. The ATG will be accepting applications in the spring semester.


New Database Subscriptions

University Libraries now offers access to two new databases:

- <u>PsycBooks</u> provides access to over 4,600 scholarly and professional eBooks published by the American Psychological Association. Titles include historical and classic works from the behavioral and social sciences as well as all volumes of the APA Handbooks in Psychology Series.
- <u>PsycTherapy</u> offers over 900 streaming videos, including unscripted psychotherapy sessions covering more than 150 therapy approaches with renowned therapists.
