Sir : In compliance with the resolution of the House of Representatives, adopted an the 10th instant, in the following terms: "Resolved, That the Secretary of the Treasury be directed to furnish to this House a statement showing what quantity of public lands, in each State and Territory of the United States, has been sold in each year since the year 1830, which had been offered for sale for periods of ten, fifteen, twenty, twenty-five, and thirty years, prior to their sale; also, what amount of public land, in each State and Territory in the United States, remains unsold, that has been in market for periods of een, fifteen, twenty, twentyfive, and thirty years:" I have the honor herewith respectfully to sabmit a report from the Commissioner of the General Land Office, together with the accompanying statements, $\mathrm{A}, \mathrm{B}, \mathrm{C}, \mathrm{D}$, which contain all the information upon the subject which can be seasonably procuped:

## General Land Office， February 24， 1840.

Sir：In relation to your reference to this office of the resolution of the House of Representatives，adopted on the 10th instant，in the words fol－ lowing，to wit：＂Resolved，That the Secretary of the Treasury be direct－ ed to furnish to this House a statemerit showing what quantity of public lands，in each State and Territory of the United States，has been sold in each year since the year 1830，which had been offered for sale for periods of ten，fifteen，twenty，twenty－five，and thirty years，prior to their sale； also，what amount of public land in each State and Territory in the United States remains unsold，that has been in market for periods of ten， fifteen，twenty，twenty－five，and thirty years ：＂
I have the honor to inform you that the preparation of the information， as literally called for，would be impracticable within any reasonable term， as it would occupy the time of twenty book－keepers for about ten weeks， and no labors heretofore incurred under analogous calls would be in the least degree available or auxiliary；and as the books would be in mo－ mentary requisition for the object，during the whole process，all other duties of the book－keepers in regard to the settlement of accounts，pre－ paring cases to be patented，and miscellaneous calls，which put the same books in requisition continually during the day，would，meanwhile，have to be suspended．

In view of all which considerations，the honorable mover of the resolu－ tion，after a conference，has been pleased to signify his willingness to accept the accompanying information as a substantial response to the call．

I would also beg leave to remark，that the classification of sales present－ ed herewith was made undér calls of both Houses of Congress in 1837， which allowed of the whole vacation between two sessions for its pre－ paration．

The statements now presented are as follows ：
A．Statement showing the quantity of public lands in each of the land districts of the United States，which had been sold on the 30th of Sep－ tember，1837；also，the quantity which remained unsold on the same day； all of which were at various times offered at public sale，from the earliest period of the sales to the 1st of January，1833；and which shows the pub－ lic lands sold，as well as those remaining unsold，in market，from twenty years and over，from fifteen to twenty years，from ten to fifteen years，and from five to ten years．

B．Exhibit of the quantity of unsold public land to which the Indian title has been extinguished；the quantity of public land to which the In－ dian title has been extinguished，not yet offered at public sale；also，the quantity of public land sold from the 30th September， 1837 ，to the 30 th September，1839，which had been offered at public sale from the earliest period to that date．

C．Exhibit of the quantity of public lands in each of the States and Territories，which remained unsold on the 30th September，1837；all of which were，at various times，offered at public sale；from the earliest period of the sales to the 1st of January，1833．
D. Exhibit of the quantity of public land offered for sale in each of the States and Territories, from the earliest periods of the sales to the 30th September, 1839 ; also, the quantity sold during the same period.
