SIR: I have the honor to transmit herewith, for the consideration of Congress, copy of a communication from the Secretary of the Interior of the 28th ultimo, inclosing copy of a letter of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, in relation to the estimate for the salary of the Indian agent at the Osage Agency, Ind. T., on page 139 of the Book of Estimates for 1889, which it is desired shall be increased from \$1,600 to \$2,000 per annum.

## DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR. OFFICE OF INDIAN AFFAIRS, Washington, D. C., December 27, 1887.

SIR: I have the honor to invite your attention to House Ex. Doc. No. 5, Fiftieth Congress, first session, page 139, containing estimates of appropriation required to pay the salary of the Indian agent for the next fiscal year at the Osage Agency, Ind. T.

This agent is allowed by law the sum of \$1,600 as salary, and the increase submitted for appropriation is \$200, being \$200 less than originally intended, as shown by the duplicate estimate on file in the Department, the sum of \$400 having been recommended as additional salary required to pay the agent at this agency.

Owing to the large amount of money disbursed at this agency annually, aggregating nearly \$300,000, it is impossible to obtain the services of an agent at the salary fixed by law, the sureties on his bond

being required to qualify for at least the sum of \$150,000.

In view of this fact, I respectfully recommend that the attention of Congress be called to this matter through the honorable Secretary of the Treasury.
