This amount, being the sum found due to the Pottawatomie Nation by the two commissioners appointed by the President of the United States to examine and report to the Secretary of the Interior upon certain claims, in pursuance of the Senate amendment to article ten of the treaty of August seventh, eighteen hundred and sixty-eight: Provided, That out of these moneys the Secretary of the Interior shall reimburse the United States for moneys advanced in payment for the new reservation selected and set apart for said Indians in the Indian Territory: Provided further, That the said Potta-		
watomies shall be charged for said new reservation an amount equal to the sum paid by the United States to the Creek and Seminole Indians for the same; and the remainder of said sum shall be paid to said Indians per capita, or invested for their benefit, by the Secretary of the Interior as a permanent fund, according as said Indians may elect, per act of August 7, 1868, 15 Stat., pp. 533, 536, sec. 10 NOTE.—For explanation, see H.
