

RESOLUTION
OF
THE LEGISLATURE OF KANSAS,

IN FAVOR OF

The transfer of the Bureau of Indian Affairs to the War Department.

MARCH 2, 1874.—Referred to the Committee on Indian Affairs and ordered to be printed.

Resolved by the senate of the State of Kansas, (the house concurring therein,) That our Senators and Representatives in the Congress of the United States assembled be, and are hereby, respectfully requested to use their influence to secure the enactment of a law requiring the transfer of the Bureau of Indian Affairs to the Department of War.

Resolved, That the secretary of state is hereby required to furnish the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and our Senators and Representatives in Congress with a copy of this resolution.
