PUYALLUP INDIAN RESERVATION.

July 8, 1890.—Committed to the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union and ordered to be printed.

Mr. Wilson, of Washington, from the Committee on Indian Affairs, submitted the following:

REPORT:

[To accompany S. 2912.]

The Committee on Indian Affairs, to whom was referred the bill (S. 2912) providing for a commission to ascertain and report certain facts relating to the Puyallup Indian Reservation in Washington, have had the same under consideration and report the same with the following amendment.

After the word "reservation," in line 24, insert the following:

And said commission shall also visit the Colville Indian Reservation in Washington and negotiate with said Colville and other bands of Indians on said reservation for the cession of such portion of said reservation as said Indians may be willing to dispose of, that the same may be opened to white settlement.

As thus amended your committee recommend the passage of the bill.
