## REPORT:

The Committee on Invalid Pensions, to which was referred the petition of Robert McBride, report:

This is a case in which the petitioner, from particular narration, appears to have served both in the revolutionary war, and in that lately with Great Britain, and together for the term of forty years. There is the certificate of the army surgeon, who knows of his service, and says the injury complained of, an inflammation of the legs, was occasioned by hard service and exposure in the Creek campaign. That he, the said surgeon, gave, in 1816, a certificate of disability from said injury, upon which petitioner received his discharge. His present disability is certified to by James A. Rereford, of Kentucky.
