JOINT RESOLUTION

OF

THE LEGISLATURE OF INDIANA,

INSTRUCTING

Its Senators and requesting its Representatives in Congress to procure the passage of a law for the relief of pre-emption settlers on the Miami reserve.

JANUARY 13, 1846. Read, and laid upon the table.

THE STATE OF INDIANA.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND FORTY-FIVE.

SECTION 1. Be it resolved by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, That our Senators in Congress be instructed, and our Representatives requested, to procure the passage of an act of Congress extending the pre-emption law of the United States to the settlers on the Miami reserve, in this State; and if the passage of such an act cannot be procured, to endeavor to procure remuneration to the settlers for their improvements, by a law similar in its provisions to the laws of the State of Indiana on that subject.

SEC. 2. And his excellency the governor of this State be requested to furnish our Senators and Representatives in Congress with a copy of this

resolution.
