

WILLIAM PARKER, A SENECA INDIAN.

FEBRUARY 12, 1841.

Read, and laid upon the table.

Mr. S. W. MORRIS, from the Committee on Invalid Pensions, submitted the following

REPORT :

*The Committee on Invalid Pensions, to whom was referred the petition of William Parker, report :*

That the petitioner, an Indian of the Seneca tribe, was placed on the pension list, by special act of Congress of May 19, 1824, at the rate of four dollars per month; he now prays to have it increased to eight dollars, "because his disability since the granting of said pension, has, by means of advanced age, become much more aggravated than it was, when said pension was granted."

In this case there is no evidence whatever, except the petition itself; the committee, therefore, report unfavorably.
