Mr. W. T. LAWRENCE, from the Committee on Invalid Pensions, made the following

REPORT:

The Committee on Invalid Pensions, to whom was referred the petition of John Holland, report:

That your petitioner was engaged at several times in the military service of the United States, (making, as he states, an aggregate of 3 years, 9 months and 12 days,) and was, as he asserts, wounded in the thigh, in an encounter with an Indian. The scar, induced by this wound, has been under the view of several persons, but as there is no confirmatory evidence of the time or circumstances of the infliction of the wound, or that he was ever laid up with it, your committee think to report in favor of the prayer of the petitioner would not be proper, and therefore beg to be discharged from the further consideration of the same.
