Mr. A. STUART, from the Committee on Invalid Pensions, made the following

REPORT.

The Committee on Invalid Pensions, to whom was referred the petition of Sidney P. Pool, of Minot, in the county of Cumberland, in the State of Maine, asking for a pension, report:

That he enlisted to serve three years in the Florida war; that the day after the battle of Withlacoochee, on a scout in pursuit of Indians, he was thrown upon the pommel of his saddle and disabled in such a manner as to entitle him to an honorable discharge, which he received on the 13th day of July, 1838.

Your committee, therefore, respectfully report a bill allowing him a pension of \$6 per month, and recommend its passage.
