Mr. WALDO, from the Committee on Revolutionary Pensions, made the following

REPORT:

The Committee on Revolutionary Pensions, to whom was referred the petition of citizens of the State of Indiana, respectfully report:

The petitioners, being citizens of the State of Indiana, represent that they have each served their country in its various battle-fields, either in the wars with the Indian tribes, or in the last war with England; and they ask a reasonable bounty from the national domain as a reward for such services.

The subject-matter of making provision for all such persons as have served the United States in any of the wars above mentioned is now before Congress in two bills—one reported by the Committee on Revolutionary Pensions, and the other reported by the Committee on Public Lands. Believing that the petitioners are suitably provided for by those bills, the committee ask to be discharged from the further consideration of this petition, and recommend that it be laid upon the table.
