Mr. Anderson, from the Committee on Invalid Pensions, made the following

## REPORT.

The Committee on Invalid Pensions, to whom was referred the petition of William Woolsey, report:

That the applicant, Wm. Woolsey, of Jackson county, Alabama, asks a pension for services rendered as a volunteer in the Seminole war, in Florida, against the Indians; says he was elected lieutenant of Captain John Smith's company of mounted men, under the command of Colonel David Corolford; that from exposure in the service he contracted a breast complaint and was compelled to return home, and has been afflicted from that day to this. That he also served in Jackson's war, in 1818, under the command of Captain Chapman; says his discharge is in the Pension Office. There is no evidence accompanying his petition, nor is it sworn to. The committee ask to be discharged from the further consideration of the petition.
