## Mr. SAVAGE, from the Committee on Military Affairs, made the following

## REPORT.

## The Committee on Military Affairs, to whom was referred the bill for the relief of Lydia Fletcher, beg leave to report:

That they have had the same under consideration, and that it appears from the proof and papers filed in the case that Abraham Fletcher, the son of Lydia Fletcher, was a soldier against the Seminoles in 1818, in Captain Williams' company of Tennessee militia, and that his pay as such soldier is still due and unpaid, and that the said Abraham has departed this life; they therefore report a bill authorizing the Secretary of the Treasury to pay the same to the mother, and recommend its passage.
