Mr. BURNS, from the Committee on Invalid Pensions, made the following

REPORT.

*The Committee on Invalid Pensions, to whom was referred the case of John Ketchum, of Monroe county, Indiana, report:*

The statement of the petitioner, under oath, sets forth, that in 1813, on returning from a neighboring block-house to his distance about two miles, in company with a militia man, who was killed by Indians, and said Ketchum, as a civilian, was at same time wounded with two musket balls. No proof of his having been enlisted into the service of the United States; the committee, therefore, report adversely to this claim.
