JOHN BLATTENBERGER—WIDOW OF.

[To accompany Bill H. R. No. 343.]

March 5, 1858.

Mr. ROBBINS, from the Committee on Invalid Pensions, made the following

REPORT.

The Committee on Invalid Pensions, to whom was referred the petition of Mary Blattenberger, report:

That it appears from the papers filed in the case that she is the widow of John Blattenberger, who was a private in the company of ptain William Downey, of the 5th regiment United States infantry, d who was killed by the Indians on the 29th day of March, 1820, whilst in the line of his duty as a private in said company and regiment. Her marriage to the said John Blattenberger is satisfactorily proven, and also the fact that she is now a widow.

Your committee are of the opinion that she is entitled to a pension under the last proviso of the first section of the act of February 3, 1853, and therefore report a bill granting her a pension for five years, at the rate of four dollars per month, said pension to commence on the

Atteenth day of February, 1858.
