## REPORT.

The Committee on Indian Affairs, to whom was referred the petition of Lecile Compare, petitioning for permission to sell her Kansas half-breed lands, report:

1. That the petition does not set forth sufficiently to the satisfaction of the committee the rights of the parties to sell said Kansas half-weed lands, and that the case, as made out and set forth by the payer of the petitioner, would not warrant and justify the committee matring said prayer.

The committee are unwilling to establish a precedent on such such twidence and testimony as has been adduced in the above case, the right of Indians of disposing of and selling any lands which may have been reserved by government for their benefit.
