SIR: I have the honor to transmit herewith an estimate of appropriation required to pay the Osage Indians the annual interest at 5 per cent. on the net proceeds of sales of the Ossge trust and diminished reserve lands, in accordance with the second article of the treaty of September 29, 1865, (Stat., 14, p. 688,) and section 12 of an act of Congress, approved July 15, 1870, (Stat., 16, p. 362,) amounting, in all, to the sum of \$105,720.71.

The accompanying copies of the report of the Acting Commissioner of Indian Affairs and other papers, it is believed, furnish full information upon the subject, and I therefore respectfully request the favorable etion of Congress upon the estimate.
