The Secretary of War has the honor to transmit to the House of Representatives, in compliance with the requirements of the act approved June 18, 1874, report of Inspector-General James A. Hardie, and accompanying papers, on the claims of the States of California and Oregon, and citizens thereof, for arms, ammunition, supplies, transportation, and services of volunteers in suppressing Indian hostilities in said States in the years 1872 and 1873, known as the "Modoc war."

General Hardie reports that \$76,758.41 will be needed for the extinguishment of these claims, and an appropriation of that amount is therefore respectfully recommended.

REPORT ON THE OREGON AND CALIFORNIA INDIAN WAR CLAIMS 1872-73,  
BY INSPECTOR-GENERAL J. A. HARDIE, U. S. A.

SIR: On the 20th of June, 1874, the following orders were issued from your office:

ORDERS.

By virtue of the authority conferred by act of Congress approved June 18, 1874 the Secretary of War directs that Inspector-General James A. Hardie, United States Army, be instructed to proceed to Salem, Oreg., and Sacramento, Cal., and such other

points in the States of Oregon and California, or elsewhere, as may be necessary, for the purpose of ascertaining the amount of expenses claimed to be necessarily incurred by the States of Oregon and California, or the citizens thereof, for arms, ammunition, supplies, transportation, and services of the volunteer forces in the suppression of Indian hostilities in said States, in the years 1872 and 1873, known as the "Modoc war."

Inspector-General Hardie will be directed to make a full report of his investigation to this Office within a reasonable period, setting forth, under each head cited in the above-mentioned act, the names of all parties claiming relief and the amounts and merits of their claims.

He will further be required to report the facts attending the inception of the claims, and to obtain and furnish any and all other information that will aid the Department in reaching a full understanding of the facts and merits concerned.

The text of the law under which the foregoing instructions were issued is as follows:

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Secretary of War be, and he is hereby, authorized and required to ascertain, or cause to be ascertained, the amount of expenses claimed to be necessarily incurred by the States of Oregon and California, or the citizens thereof, for arms, ammunition, supplies, transportation, and services of the volunteer forces in the suppression of Indian hostilities in said States in the years eighteen hundred and seventy-two and eighteen hundred and seventy-three, and report the same to Congress at the next session, together with the names of persons who claim to be entitled to relief, together with a statement of the facts and sums upon which such report may be based.*

Having finished the investigation with which I have been charged, I report in the premises as follows:

Immediately upon the receipt of my orders, I proceeded to Oregon and California. Arriving at Salem, in Oregon, I called upon Governor Grover, who promptly and cheerfully put the records of his office at my disposition, and furnished me every other facility for my investigation. The secretary of state, the adjutant-general, the governor's secretary, the commanding and staff officers of the troops, and other State officials, all rendered me every assistance in their power. The assistant adjutant-general of the Department of Columbia, Maj. H. Clay Wood, also afforded me important aid.

I visited the different places in the States named, where the more important purchases were made and expenses were incurred. I examined all persons that I could reach connected in any way with the accounts in question, generally under oath, requiring in most cases sworn statements of the correctness of their accounts as presented to the State. I ascertained the nature of the transactions of the administrative officers connected with the expedition, and every other important fact, it is believed, relating to the acquisition and disposition of the property concerned; the raising, service, and disbandment of the troops.

Having been at the Lava Beds during the Modoc operations last year, and having traveled over most of the routes used by the troops, I was in a position to become readily acquainted, through a second visit, with the leading features of the region in which the expenditures originated; and, besides, to become well acquainted with men and things concerned.

Thus prepared for an intelligent study of these accounts, laborious care has been expended in their examination, with a view to a report thereon satisfactory to the War Department, and furnishing a safe basis of action thereupon by Congress.

CLAIMS OF THE STATE OF OREGON.

The records of the State of Oregon show that the expenses under investigation, incurred by it, classified as required by the text of the statute, are as follows :

Errors of small importance in the accounts vary these amounts slightly, but do not materially affect the total. They will be noted in the list of accounts given herewith.

Small additional claims of citizens on account of services rendered, &c., amount to \$213.50. These claims were not taken up by the State authorities, through the omission of the claimants to file them in time.

On the 24th of March, 1874, General Schofield forwarded to the War Department a communication from Governor La Fayette Grover, of Oregon, dated February 13, 1874, being a full report of the history of the Modoc troubles, of the connection of the State authorities with the military operations resorted to for the suppression of the Modoc disturbances and for the protection of the frontier, and embodying also abstracts of expenditures involved, returns of property, rolls of troops and citizens employed, and giving, in short, a full and explicit account of every branch of the subject in hand from his own point of view. General Schofield's action was had in obedience to a call from the War Department for information upon the topics in question, anticipatory of the investigation subsequently directed by Congress.

As will be seen hereafter, the awards of amounts in re-imbusement of expenses to the State by the United States differ materially from the figures cited by the governor, as expressing the indebtedness of the State on account of its operations in connection with the suppression of the Modoc insurrection. Nevertheless, it is a favorable starting-point in the investigation with which I am charged. I transmit herewith copies of this document and its inclosures, so far as they concern the matter in hand.

So far as relates to the history of the Modoc insurrection, the causes which produced it, its progress, and suppression by the military forces, it is assumed that no report is expected from me; and if one were called for, nothing could probably be added to the full information on these topics already spread upon the records of Congress. It is believed that I shall do all that is expected of me by confining my report to the limits observed in the sequel.

The discussion of the claims in question in the body of this report will be general, directed to the explanation of the claims and to the presenting of the considerations essential to their disposition. Details will be left to be presented in tabulated form. A schedule accompanies the report which notes each item of every account, contains brief explanations of matters important to proper action thereon, and is believed to furnish all the information which may be necessary to enable the accounts to be properly disposed of.

There were two periods of employment of troops by the State of Oregon. The first was in December, 1872, and January, 1873; the occasion was the wide-spread dismay through the settlements of Southern Oregon, caused by the massacre of citizens, on the 29th and 30th of November, by Modocs on the borders of Tule Lake. After the affair of the 17th of January, 1873, in which, under the command of General Wheaton, our forces were not successful in their endeavor to subdue the Modocs, it will be remembered that it was determined to adopt other measures in the premises than those of coercion, and the volunteer troops were withdrawn. These measure proved entirely fruitless, and were followed by the base assassination of the peace commissioners and the breaking out of new hostilities. The alarm of the settlers in the Basin (as the region which was the scene of operations is called) was so great that the governor was induced to make a second call for troops. These troops were in service in the latter part of April, May, and a portion of June, 1873.

The following troops of the first brigade, Oregon Mounted Militia, were called into service at the first call:

Company A, raised principally in Jacksonville: captain, Harrison Kelly; first lieutenant, J. W. Berry; second lieutenant, E. R. Reams; and 62 non-commissioned officers and privates. Average service about 53 days, from December, 1872, and January, 1873, to February 2, 1873.

Company B, raised principally at Yainax and Jacksonville: captain, Oliver C. Applegate; first lieutenant, J. H. Hyser; second lieutenant, F. F. Downing; and 66 non-commissioned officers and privates. Average service about 51 days, from December, 1872, and January, 1873, to February 2, 1873.

The following troops of the first brigade, Oregon Mounted Militia, were called into service at the second call:

Company C, raised principally in Jacksonville and Roseburgh: captain, Joseph H. Hyser; first lieutenant, George W. Lindsay; second lieutenant, John Marsh; and 62 non-commissioned officers and privates.

Average service about 54 days, from May and June, 1873, to June 18-22, 1873.

Company D, raised in Goose-Lake Valley: captain, Thomas Mulholland; first lieutenant, Thomas Lofton; second lieutenant, Robert Pleasants; and 40 non-commissioned officers and privates. Average service about 33 days, from May and June, 1873, to June 23, 1873.

Company E, raised at Roseburgh and Oakland: captain, George R. Rogers; first lieutenant, Solon Allen; second lieutenant, Dorus Hutchins; and 38 non-commissioned officers and privates. Average service about 46 days, from April and May, 1873, to June 21, 1873.

Both bodies of troops were under the general command of Brig. Gen. John E. Ross.

Of the foregoing troops there were—

Killed: J. R. Brown, Company A, at Lava Beds, January 17, 1873; W. F. Trimble, Company B, at Lava Beds, January 17, 1873.

Died: William Rexford, Company A, January 3, 1873, of disease contracted in the service.

Deserted: J. E. Ish, Company A, December 6, 1872; William S. Mansfield, Company E, May 15, 1873.

The following is a list of the general staff and their period of service:

Maj. Gen. John F. Miller, supervising movements, 41 days; and two aids, Lieut. Col. William Thompson, 41 days; Lieut. Col. C. C. Bellinger, 41 days.

Brig. Gen. John E. Ross, commanding first brigade Oregon militia, active commander, 174 days; and three aids, Maj. W. A. Owen, acting quartermaster and commissary, 179 days; Capt. E. D. Foudray, 89 days; Capt. James R. Neill, 145 days.

Col. Jesse N. Barker, quartermaster-general, 246 days; Maj. Quincy A. Brooks, assistant quartermaster-general and principal accountant, 370 days.

Col. J. N. T. Miller, commissary-general, 308 days; Maj. E. C. Mason, assistant commissary-general, 11 days.

Maj. J. N. Bell, brigade surgeon, 73 days; Maj. Charles H. Adair, brigade surgeon, 59 days.

Douglas and Jackson Counties in Oregon was the theater of supply, both of men and material; while the neighborhoods of Tule Lake, in Klamath County, Oregon, and Siskiyou and Modoc Counties in California, were the scenes of the employment and operation of the troops.

The accompanying map, drawn to a scale of twelve miles to the inch, furnishes all the geographical and topographical information essential to an understanding of the subject of transportation, and all accounts where distances and character of country affect the expense.

The purchases of quartermaster and subsistence property were made principally in Roseburgh, Jacksonville, and Portland. The purchasing officers were (for supplies pertaining to the quartermaster's department) Quartermaster-General Jesse N. Barker and Maj. W. A. Owen. Maj. Quincy A. Brooks had principal charge of books and accounts.

The subsistence supplies were purchased under the direction of Col. J. N. T. Miller. Returns were carefully made, at the close of the second service, of all the transactions pertaining to the quartermaster and subsistence departments; copies of them accompany this report.

A board of State auditors, consisting of the governor, the secretary of state, and the adjutant-general, was assembled to examine and audit the accounts, so far as to determine the indebtedness of the State to

individuals, whether for service or supplies. I transcribe an extract from their report of proceedings, for the purpose of exhibiting their method of audit.

STATE OF OREGON, SALEM, *May 1, 1874.*

The board of military auditors met this day at 9 o'clock a. m., at the office of the adjutant-general, by order of his excellency L. F. Grover, governor of the State of Oregon, for the purpose of auditing and adjusting the Modoc Indian war-claims, being the accounts of the expenses of the Oregon militia in suppressing Indian hostilities, and protecting the settlements in Southeastern Oregon, in the years 1872-'73.

Present: Col. A. P. Dennison, adjutant-general; S. F. Chadwick, secretary of state.

Ordered, That James Walton act as clerk of the board in the auditing and adjustment of said accounts, and that his compensation be fixed at \_\_\_\_\_ dollars per diem. (Afterward allowed at \$200 per month.)

Ordered, That Maj. Quincy A. Brooks, assistant quartermaster-general, attend the sittings of the board, to furnish information and assistance in reference to the claims aforesaid.

Ordered, That the clerk, with the assistance of Major Brooks, prepare an abstract of all the claims or accounts referred to in accordance with the form agreed on by the board, and have the same in readiness at its next meeting.

STATE OF OREGON, SALEM, *May 8, 1874.*

The board of military auditors met at 9 o'clock, a. m., at the office of the adjutant-general.

Present: His excellency L. F. Grover, governor; Col. A. P. Dennison, adjutant-general; Hon. S. F. Chadwick, secretary of state.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

The clerk presented an abstract of the Indian war-claims ordered by the board; which was accepted and approved.

The following rules were adopted by the board for its government in the auditing and adjustment of the Modoc Indian war-accounts referred to, viz:

Rule 1st. It having been found impossible to enlist troops for the pay allowed for similar service in the United States Army, as provided by the militia law of this State, the claims of non-commissioned officers and privates will be audited on the basis of two dollars per diem, and an appropriation to pay said troops at that rate will be recommended, in accordance with the agreement made with them at the time of enlistment.

Rule 2d. The sum of two dollars per day will be allowed for the use of each horse furnished to the service for the time shown on the muster-roll.

Rule 3d. The pay of all commissioned officers of said militia for the period actually served, as shown on the proper rolls, will be in accordance with pay allowed to officers of similar rank in the United States Army, as provided in section 24 of the act of Congress approved July 15, 1870, entitled "An act making appropriations for the support of the Army for the year ending June 30, 1871, and for other purposes;" and also as provided in section 44 of chapter 33 of the general laws of Oregon.

Rule 4th. The cost of subsistence issued to commissioned officers in said militia service, as shown on the commissary returns, will be deducted from the pay of said officers at the rate of 32½ cents per ration.

Rule 5th. In reference to extra-duty claims, the board rules—

1. As Company E is the only company presenting any claim for the services of a company clerk, and as it would be inconsistent to allow those claims without making a similar allowance in favor of the other four companies, that all claims for that character of extra duty will be disallowed.

2. All other claims for extra duty will be allowed where such duty was continuous for ten or more days, at a rate not exceeding two dollars per day.

Rule 6th. Stoppages duly certified will be audited and deducted from the claims against which they appear unless found incorrect.

After a careful consideration of the said war-claims presented under the foregoing rules, and the testimony taken in reference to the character of services, and the quantity and quality of supplies furnished, and their prices, and a full investigation of all the circumstances connected with the service, the board have approved the several accounts in the following abstract.

The abstracts of indebtedness accompanying the report of Governor Grover, herewith, contain the action of the board in determining who were lawful claimants, and the amounts found due to them from the

State. These awards differ but little from the claims laid before the board, which were, in fact, the accounts of all parties concerned, as prepared by the accountants, of whom, as I have said, Major Brooks was the principal.

For all issues of stores of any kind consumed by the troops, or used by them in service, except clothing, requisitions and receipts were prepared at the time of final adjustment, covering all the transactions of the whole period. These papers were presented to the company officers and others concerned for their signatures, and form the vouchers by which the quartermasters and commissaries acquitted themselves of their responsibility to the State for the property acquired by them. These returns are prepared in similar shape to that in use in the Army.

Supplies in excess of the authorized allowance under the Army regulations, were, in certain instances, accounted for under some other head, in order that the accounts could more readily be made to pass audit. While this process of substitution of one article for another, impairs the value of the papers as exact accounts, (and I am not prepared to excuse it,) still it is the fact that it is an irregularity common to the administration of new levies. It is not always designed to be fraudulent; and, in fact, where no wrong is intended, it is by many deemed to be quite proper. The practice does not probably vary more from a high standard of rectitude than do the ordinary transactions of trade. My examinations have been so thorough upon this point, that I am convinced of having been acquainted with every material departure in the accounts from the strict facts concerned. Notes of these cases, as they come up, will be found in the discussion of the accounts in the schedule appended. They are, however, unimportant in amount, and as they do not seriously affect results, they may for the present be dropped out of notice.

In determining the amounts due from the United States to the State of Oregon in reimbursement of the moneys expended, the following facts, it appears to me, establish the method of adjustment.

Referring to the pay of the troops, the militia law of the State of Oregon expressly says that where volunteer troops are called into State service, they shall receive the same compensation that United States troops do for the same period. The troops in question were called out by the governor for State service. They were volunteers expressly engaged to serve the State, under officers appointed by State authorities. They never were at any time mustered into the service of the United States, though they served, as seen elsewhere, in co-operation with United States troops and under general command of United States officers. In the adjustment of all claims for military services, arising on the part of States or Territories, against the United States, the rule is to allow the same scale of pay, allowances, and emoluments as is adopted in the United States service.

In the case in question, however, the board of audit, as we have seen, allowed two dollars a day for the pay of private soldiers, and two dollars a day for the use of private horses taken into service. These allowances were made because upon the engagement of the men it was understood by the enrolling officers that the authorities at Salem, though they could not officially promise payment of that amount, favored that standard of payment, and promised that especial measures should be taken to have that standard legalized at the next session of the legislature.

The prices charged for supplies were naturally high, though rarely exorbitant. The United States was enabled to purchase at lower

figures at the same time and in the same places. In this branch of the examination I had the efficient assistance of Col. E. W. Stone, first lieutenant Twenty-first Infantry, who was the active and zealous quartermaster at Jacksonville and Yreka during the Modoc operations. In examining parties furnishing supplies, it was almost the universal admission that a higher scale of prices than the ruling rates had been charged, on account of there being no appropriation on the part of the State to make any payments, and that consequently parties furnishing supplies would be compelled to wait an indefinite time for their money. Awards have been made in most instances, at the rates the regular Army was paying at the time, or at what was found to be a just scale of charge.

The subsistence was in excess, in variety of food as well as in quantity, of the usual allowance of rations to United States troops. Issues were made to all officers. The clothing and certain other articles purchased were charged to the men at the rates which the State contracted to pay the dealers. In issues of clothing there was no attempt to be governed by the regulations on that subject in vogue in the Army. At the rates of pay and clothing allowances established for the Army, many of the soldiers would have been charged with sufficient clothing to have consumed all the pay to which they were entitled.

In adjustment of its accounts with claimants, the State of Oregon issued certified vouchers in the nature of certificates of indebtedness, in accordance with the provision of a general law authorizing the proper authorities to issue such certificates to cover awards of the military auditors. Thus every claimant received the obligation of the State to liquidate its indebtedness, and holders of such paper look to the State and not to the United States to redeem it. Measures, it is understood, are now in progress in the Oregon legislature to raise the necessary money for the liquidation.

In this condition of things, it would seem fair that the United States should but pay into the State treasury the amount of the obligations of the State for the purchase of arms and munitions, cavalry and quartermaster horses, and military supplies; for transportation, forage, medical attendance, and the necessary citizens' labor employed, at such rates as the United States was paying on the spot at the time. On account of pay of troops, the re-imbusement can only reasonably extend to such an amount as the United States would have paid the same officers and the same men had they been mustered into the service. For the hire of the cavalry-horses upon which the troops were mounted, the United States scale of computation should be allowed. For the subsistence, the number of rations which the troops would have consumed had they been regularly mustered into the service, commuted at the cost-price of the ration where they served, fixes the rate of re-imbusement. For the clothing, an amount should be reimbursed the State equal to the usual commutation-allowance for clothing to volunteers when called into service.

Some of the principal amounts claimed to be expended by the State for supplies were for the following items, viz:

More provisions and forage are set down than were actually purchased; the details appear in the tabulated list.

All the articles purchased, with the exceptions to be noted, are accounted for as having been disposed of or consumed for the benefit of the expedition. The general disposition of the property is not made the subject of adverse criticism especially. New levies are careless in the use and distribution of supplies. At the close of the expedition certain stores left over were sold. They appear on the following list, which, it should be added, contains items of charges for property issued to and retained by the men, and accounted for as sold to them.

A portion of the proceeds of the sales naturally should be deducted from the sum total to be otherwise re-imbursed the State, for if the United States assume responsibility for the purchase of these articles, it should either receive them back at the close of the operations in the condition the service left them, or their value at sale should be off-setted. Clothing and other articles of outfit and tobacco were charged to the men as they drew them, at the rates at which they were purchased, so that these articles appear upon the returns for the sake of accountability; whereas, in fact, they were purchases made by the men themselves of the dealers through the proper officers. These items may, therefore, be left out of account, so far as any re-imbusement in their connection concerns the United States. Subsistence and clothing will be allowed to the State, as has been said, at Army rates for all the troops and citizens entitled to rations, but the articles other than subsistence on the

list of sales belong either in kind or in value to the United States in these accounts. The amount they brought at sale, \$2,852.83, is, therefore, deducted from the amount of awards.

A considerable portion of indebtedness accrues, it is observed, on account of clerical labor for the adjustment of property-accounts at the close of the expedition. A reasonable period, it is believed, is allowed in this connection by the establishment of the date of the 1st of July, 1873, as that at which expenses for clerical labor should cease. It will also be noted that the salaries of civilian enrolling officers to recruit the men, appraisers to determine the value of property acquired or sold, and members of the board of audit to ascertain the indebtedness of the State, are included as subjects of charge against the United States. Such are not normal military war-accounts, they arise out of the working of the civil machinery of the State, under its laws for raising a levy and adjusting its affairs. The officers of the militia are the usual and proper enrolling officers. The matter should not give rise to any expenditures for which the United States may be deemed chargeable, and these claims have accordingly been disallowed.

The accounts for the State, and all the figures used in this report, represent coin, instead of currency, at 90 cents average.

Certain claims, it will be seen, are suspended for want of sufficient evidence to induce a favorable report.

The amounts of the awards upon the accompanying schedule of claims in detail, adjusted by the methods laid down above, so far as the items of pay, clothing, subsistence, service of horses, &c., are concerned, are in recapitulation as follows:

Examination of the schedule of claims and awards in detail will show that certain claims are suspended for want of sufficient proof. Were the United States to re-imburse the State for clothing purchased, on any other basis than that of the usual Government allowance of \$3.50 per month per soldier, the list of suspended accounts would be perhaps greater, though not notably so. The claims actually suspended for want of proof amount to \$2,369.75.

#### CLAIMS OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

Upon calling on Governor Booth, at Sacramento, I was informed by him that the claims for re-imbursement of moneys expended by the State of California, in connection with the Modoc hostilities, were only on account of the transportation of arms to the front, and back to the State depots. On the 28th of July, 1874, he addressed to me a communication covering an account of this indebtedness, which in all amounts to \$495.72. The communication and accompanying memorandum are transmitted herewith.

The governor observes in this communication, that he is informed that services were rendered to the United States troops, and losses incurred by many of the residents of Siskiyou County, for which no claims have ever been made against the State, nor is there any provision of law authorizing their payment by the State authorities.

A thorough examination of these claims was made by me in Siskiyou County, abundant opportunity being afforded for the hearing of claimants and the examination of witnesses.

The State took no steps to have any troops mustered into service. At the close of the second period of the Modoc war, the uneasiness of the citizens of Siskiyou County, it is true, had induced the governor to give his approval to the raising of a company, but the close of the war came, and the subject was dropped.

Of the citizens of Siskiyou County rendering services in connection with the conduct of the operations against the Modocs, the most conspicuous was Capt. John Fairchild. He raised a small volunteer organization, and was engaged with it in the fight of the 17th of November, 1872, under command of General Wheaton, in which four men were wounded, two subsequently dying from the injuries then received. Fairchild's ranch is situated within a few miles of the Lava Beds. Adjacent to it is Dorris's ranch. The men employed upon these ranches, with a few other settlers, claim to have formed, besides the company serving under General Wheaton, a quasi organization for a considerable period of time before and after the date of the fight, involving, in fact, the autumn and winter of 1872, and part of the spring of 1873, covering the whole period of the Modoc troubles. I caused to be prepared a muster-roll of the company serving under General Wheaton. It is appended hereto. It will be seen that there were one captain, one lieutenant, and twenty-seven men then engaged for eight days. Their services are acknowledged, in official reports, to have been valuable. They should receive in compensation, therefore, certainly the full pay, allowances, and commutation of clothing and horse-hire of mounted cavalry soldiers furnishing their own horses and subsistence; and such has been my award.

As connected with the quasi organization above referred to, Captain Fairchild has presented a claim for the pay of a cavalry captain, from the 30th of December, 1872, to July 1, 1873, for himself, and the regular pay and allowances for supplies, of horse-hire, forage, and subsistence

for ten men for seventy-two days, and four other men for forty-two days.

In connection with the subject of this claim of Captain Fairchild, General Jefferson C. Davis, in a letter to me, dated the 27th of August, 1874, after stating that he became acquainted with Captain F. while *en route* to take command of the troops in the Lava Beds, and that he subsequently had his headquarters at Captain Fairchild's ranch, says as follows:

A very short acquaintance satisfied me that he was a reliable citizen; a brave man, who had an interest in the country and wished the war to be put down as soon as possible. I took him into my confidence, and from this on until the close of the difficulty, by the capture of the whole Modoc band, he gave his counsel freely, and always took his chances conspicuously on all occasions where danger was to be met.

I made no bargain with him; he simply came to me as a citizen who seemed to desire the savage murderers of his neighbors and friends punished as quickly as possible. He did not talk about pay or risk. He served me in this capacity something more than a month.

He informs me that he has recently met with heavy pecuniary losses, which induce him to make and urge this claim. I hope the Government will consider his case, and pay him a just compensation.

The correspondence between Captain Fairchild and General Davis and myself is appended.

I can add my own testimony, from personal observation, as to the esteem in which Captain Fairchild's services were held, and as to their real value; and I appreciate myself the merit of a claim for pay for services, and also for certain supplies furnished. His house and ranch, as well as Dorris's, were rendezvous in fact of officers and troops operating with reference to the Lava Beds, more or less during the whole time of the Modoc troubles.

In connection with the same quasi organization, and with similar color of justice, ten citizens have presented claims for services and clothing at Fairchild's ranch, and in that vicinity within the field of operations, from November 30, 1872, to February 20, 1873, with the exception of eight days, making a period of seventy-four days. Four men make the same claim for a period of forty-two days, from December 4, 1872, to January 16, 1873. Three men claim to have served forty-two days at Dorris's ranch and neighborhood, from December 4, 1872, to January 16, 1873.

Presley A. Dorris, further, claims for furnishing three men with forage for their horses, and subsistence for themselves, for forty-two days, at United States rates. Also for himself he claims pay for services assimilated to those of an officer of the United States Army, from the 30th of November, 1872, to the 20th of February, 1873, a period of seventy-four days, excluding eight days, for which he has already presented a bill. These services are described, by sworn statements appended, to have been of an extra hazardous nature. At the first brush of hostilities an imperfect organization undoubtedly was formed by these men, naturally under the control of Fairchild and Dorris, the owners of the ranches and their employes mainly. Dorris and Fairchild's ranches, it will be recollected, were the habitat of a considerable band of Modocs. The duties performed, however, were rather those of guides and scouts than organized troops. I have no doubt that their services were of value.

Captain Fairchild has been allowed pay during this period as principal scout and guide, and Mr. Dorris has been allowed at the rate of \$75 per month. The remaining men have been awarded the amounts claimed by them—fifty-five cents per diem, pay and clothing allowance

of United States soldiers, which is little enough for the services performed. These claims are thus moderate, because I was on the spot before their presentation, and cautioned claimants to be reasonable in their demands.

The claims of Fairchild and Dorris, for supplies of subsistence and forage, are certainly moderate, considering the entertainment not only of the persons named, but of many others for whom no claim can be presented, but who were all more or less connected with the operations. The cost of the Army ration at the time of the operations, and on the spot, is reported to me by the Commissary-General of Subsistence to be twenty-seven and three-tenths cents. The cost of the ration of forage at the time, at rates which I have allowed to Oregon claimants for forage, is sixty cents. Under the act of July 22, 1861, \$3.50 per month is allowed to non-commissioned officers and privates for clothing not furnished in kind; and for the use and risk of horses, forty cents per day. These rates of payment for the mounting and subsistence of guides and scouts are by far the cheapest disposition of the subject of payment for this branch of the claim.

A claim is presented by William Hice for 1 horse, 1 Henry rifle, and 1 revolver, lost in action—for \$180, total; but it is suspended for want of proof.

These suspensions may be hereafter raised upon the production of satisfactory evidence. They should not therefore be left out of account in the estimate for the appropriation. It is estimated that, if allowed, the amount of awards thereon would not exceed \$2,049.

An appropriation, therefore, of \$76,758.41 will be needed for the extinguishment of the claims under consideration if the proposed bases of adjustment be adopted.
