RESOLUTION

THE LEGISLATURE OF KANSAS,

ASKING

For the re-appraisement of the New York Indian lands in Bourbon County, Kansas.

FEBRUARY 24, 1874.—Referred to the Committee on Indian Affairs and ordered to be printed.

Be it resolved by the house of representatives of the State of Kansas, the senate concurring therein, That our Senators in Congress are instructed, and our Representatives are earnestly requested, to use all honorable means in their power to secure a re-appraisement of lands in Bourbon County, Kansas, known as the "New York Indian lands."

Resolved, That the secretary of state be, and is hereby, instructed to forward a copy of this resolution to each of our Senators and members of the House of Representatives in Congress.
