

REMOVING WISCONSIN INDIANS.

RESOLUTION

OF

THE LEGISLATURE OF WISCONSIN,

INDORSING

The action of the Secretary of the Interior in removing Indians from the State of Wisconsin, and asking that all tribes be removed from the borders thereof.

FEBRUARY 24, 1874.—Referred to the Committee on Indian Affairs and ordered to be printed.

Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That it is the sense of this legislature that the policy of removing the Indians of this State to proper reservations in the Indian and other Western Territories and States be approved, and request that the removal may be continued until all the tribes are removed from the borders of the State.

Resolved, That the secretary of state be requested to forward a copy of this resolution to each of our members in Congress, and to the Secretary of the Interior.
