

LEGISLATIVE, EXECUTIVE, AND JUDICIAL APPROPRIATION BILL.

FEBRUARY 2, 1881.—Recommended to the Committee on Appropriations and ordered to be printed.

Mr. ATKINS, from the Committee on Appropriations, submitted the following

REPORT :

[To accompany bill H. R. 7101.]

In presenting to the House the bill making appropriations for the legislative, executive, and judicial expenses of the government for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1882, the Committee on Appropriations herewith submit the following report :

The estimates upon which the bill is based are to be found on pages 9 to 56, and 59 to 63, of the book of estimates.

The total estimates for the legislative, executive, and judicial expenses submitted in the book of estimates, added to subsequent estimates submitted by letter from heads of departments, aggregate in all \$17,771,857.49; of which sum the committee, after thorough and exhaustive consideration of the requirements of the service, recommend in this bill \$17,181,091.09. The appropriations for the same purposes for the current fiscal year amounted to \$16,301,205.52, or \$879,885.57 less than is recommended by the committee for the ensuing fiscal year.

The following statements will explain more fully and in detail the bill, and make a comparison of the items composing it with the appropriations of same character for the present year, and the estimates upon which it is based. The increase for clerical force and other expenses for the service of the government for the fiscal year 1882, recommended in this bill, is as follows :
