Mr. STRAIT, from the Committee on Military Affairs, submitted the following

REPORT:

[To accompany bill H. R. 1116.]

The Committee on Military Affairs, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 1116) for the relief of the heirs of George Fisher, report the same back to the House, with the recommendation that it lie on the table.

This bill provides to re-enact the act or resolution of Congress approved June 1, 1860, in favor of the heirs and legal representatives of George Fisher, deceased, for military spoliation by the United States troops during the war with the Creek Indians, and that the appropriations contained in the first section of the original act passed for the relief of the claimants shall not be allowed to lapse in consequence of the delay in the adjustment, &c.

Without any evidence whatever offered before your committee to arrive at a fair and just conclusion as to the reasonableness of the demand for the passage of this act, they recommend that it do not pass.
